29 June 1923

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill met in the Mayor's Office a 3:30 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

The Aldermen present were Messers. G.M.Braune, J.M.Cheek, D.D.Carroll, and H.A.Whitfield.

The list of proposed values of all real estate in the town was presented and discusses at length. It was decided that it was necessary to go over this list in detail before meeting with the County Commissioners. All the members present proceeded with this work.

The subject of blasting in the town was brought up for discussion and upon motion of Alderman J.M. Cheek seconded by Alderman H.A. Whitfield the following ordinance was duly passed:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. No person, firm, or corporation shall do any blasting of any nature within the limits of the town.

Section 2. The Town Business Manager may issue permits for blasting; said permits to be in writing and a separate permit shall be obtained for each and every blast.

Section 3. Any person, firm, or corporation found guilty of violating any section of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$50.00 for each offence.

Section 4. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict wherewith are hereby repealed.

The question of appointments in the Police Department was then brought up for discussion and upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield the following resolution was duly passed:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. The Town Business Manager is hereby authorized toappoint George T. Featherston Chief of Police of Chapel Hill. Section 2. The Town Business Manager is hereby instructed to inform Police Officers S.F.Long and H.M.Williams of this appointment and to tell them that they are subject to orders from the Mayor, the Manager and the Chief of Police and any failure on their part to carry out promptly any order received would be sufficient cause for their immediate dismissal from the force.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 11 P.M.

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill met at 8 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

The Addermen present were Messers. D.D.Carroll, J.M.Cheek, and H.A.Whitfield.

The work and accomplishments of the Health Officer and Sanitary Inspector were discussed and upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield the following resolution was duly passed:

OF CHAPEL HILL:

The Board of Aldermen, recognizing the initiative of the University of North Carolina in inaugurating the office of Sanitary Inspector for the University and the town, and its payment of the major portion of the Inspector's salary, has left the direction of the duties of the Inspectoralmost entirely to the University, and for that reason is without a history of what has been accomplished since the office was created. In planning the administration of the municipal affairs during the approaching college year, the Town considers a comprehensive survey of the work and accomplishments of the Sanitary Inspector during his tenure innthe past, and what is proposed during the coming year indespensible; also, it desires an expression of the University's opinion on what has been done already. The Mayor is requested to immediately submit this expression of the Town's views to the University and to invite its early attention to the same.

The town tax rate for 1923 was discussed and upon motion of Alderman H.A. Whitfield seconded by Alderman D.D. Carroll the following resolution was duly passed:

OF CHAPEL HILL: BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN

Section 1. The following tax rates per \$100 valuation of property are hereby levied on all real and personal property in the Town and directed to be collected by the Town Tax Col-

Section 2. The following polls are hereby levied on all male residents of the Town, over 21 and not over 50 years of age, and are directed to be collected by the Town Tax Collector:

The Audit of the town books for the year ended May 31,1923 was presented by Mr. E.E.Peacock and upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman J.M. Theek the following resolution was duly passed:

A special meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill is hereby ordered to be held on September 14,1923 for the purpose of making a thorough study the the audit as presented by Mr. Peacock.

In the presentation of the audit the fact was brought out that the interest received from the Peoples Bank as Trearurer of the Sewer Sinking Funds did not include the interest on moneys in the Sewer Fund from October 1922 to April 1923. The Town Business Manager was instructed to take this matter up with the bank and demand this interest.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
