## 1 November 1923

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill met at 8:30 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

Aldermen present were Messers. G.M.Braune, D.D.Carroll, J.M.Cheek and H.A.Whitfield.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

The Town Business Manager reported that an application for a sewer line on Hillsboro and North Streets near their intersection had been made. Upon motion of Alderman G.M.Braune seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield, duly passed, the Manager was instructed to have the necessary surveys made and to investigate the cost of said line and the revenue which could be derived therefrom.

The Town Business Manager recommended that immediate steps be taken to have a Sewage Disposal Plantwinstalled. Upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield, duly passed, the Manager was instructed to invite Mr. H.E.Miller, Director of the Bureau of Engineering of the State Board of Health, to come here and talk with the Board of Aldermen in regard to the adequacy of our sewer system and sewage disposal plants. The Manager was further instructed to invite Dr. H.W.Chase and Mr. C.T. Woolen of the University to meet with the Board at the same time.

The Town Business Manager reported that Mr. J.P.Foister's lease on the Old Fire House had expired and upon motion was instructed to rent same to the highest bidder.

Upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll, seconded by Alderman H.A.Whitfield, duly passed, a committee was created to condider proposed changes in the street trees and other aesthetic problems. Said committee consisting of two members of the Board of Alderman, two members of the Community Club, and a professor of Botany in the University of North Carolina. Mayor Roberson appointed Alderman G.M.Braune and J.M.Cheek to serve on this committee.

Aldermen G.M. Braune made a report on the application of Mr. Fugene Andrews to have town drain ditch in front of his property closed up. Mr. Braune recommended that the drainage at this point (Corner of Franklin and Malette Streets) be changed and a culvert installed crossing Franklin Street diagonally an shown in the accompanying sketches. Upon Motion of Alderman D.D. Carroll, seconded by Alderman J.M. Cheek, duly passed this report was accepted and the Manager was instructed to make said improvements and install said culvert if property owners benefited thereby were willing to pay one-half of the cost.





6 December 1923

There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill at 6 45 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

The Aldermen present were Messers. R.P. Andrews, G.M. Braune, D.D. Carroll and J.M. Cheek.

The Town Business Manager stated that in accordance with instructions from the Board, he had taken up with the American-La France Fire Engine Co. the charge of \$710.51 for repairs to the fire truck on December 3,1921. The Town Business Manager felt that these repairs were made necessary by improper instructions received from the Delivering Engineer of the American-LaFrance Co. The American-LaFrance Co. neither denied nor accepted our contention but made the following proposition: - first, deduct from the \$710.51 for parts returned \$150.00; second, waive all interest charges; third, Town of Chapel Hill pay one-half the balance due in liquidation of the entire debt. Thus:

A motion was made by Alderman R.P.Andrews and seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek that the sum of \$280.26 be piad to the American-LaFrance Fire Engine Co. in liquidation of this debt; the aldermen present voting as follows:

> "Yes" - R.P. Andrews, G.M. Braune, J.M. Cheek "No" - D.D.Carroll

The Mayor ruled the motion as passed and instructed the Town Business Manager to make this payment.

nd Cameron

Alderman G.M. Braune, Chairman of the Street and Tree Committee made a report on the situation caused by grading the lot owned by the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity at the corner of Columbia Street and Cameron Aveenue. The Tree Committee recommended that a permanent grade be established for the sidewalk on Cameron Avenue, that the necessary grading be done, and the sidewalk curved so as to allow the elm tree at the corner to remain standing. PROVIDED THAT the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity will do the grading, put in a premanent sidewalk, and plant new trees along the sidewalk at their own expense. Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews, seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek, duly passed the foregoing report was accepted and the Town Business Manager was instructed to take this matter up with the representatives of the Delta Kappa Epsilon Fraternity and get a written agreement from them that they would make said improvements at their expense.

Attorney Carl Weigand appeared before the Board requesting permission to have one or two vaudeville acts in connection with the moving picture show operated by Henry Guthrie. Upon motion made, seconded and duly passed the following resolution was adopted:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Whereas, the moving picture show operated by Henry Guthrie is already under suspicion of being conducted improperly and a menance to public morals. And Whereas, even now the Board of Aldermen is on the verge of declaring said place a nuisance and ordering the license to be revoked;
