There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen in the Mayor's Office at 4:30 P.M.

The Aldermen present were Messers. R.P. Andrews, G.M. Braune and H.A. Whitfield.

Note for
\$3,000.00

The Town Business Manager reported that due to the shortage in the collection of the 1923 Taxes that it would be necessary to borrow money on short term notes in anticipation of collection of taxes. In support of this report the Town Business Manager presented figures showing that at this time last year 55.5% of the Property Taxes had been collected and at the present time only 23.1% had been collected. Upon motion of Alderman H.A. Whitfield seconded by Alderman G.M. Braune the following resolution was duly passed, all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor, to-wit:- Aldermen R.P. Andrews, G.M. Braune, and H.A. Whitfield, the said resolution being as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That the Mayor and the Town Business Manager are hereby authorized to issue a note for the sum of THREE THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$3,000.00) for a period of thirty (30) days in anticipation of receipts from the Property Taxes for the year 1923.

Section 2. That the proceeds derived from the said note are to be used for current expenses provided for in the Annual Budget duly adopted by the said Board of Aldermen.

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill adjourned at 5 P.M.

7 February 1924

The Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill met at 7:45 P.M.

The Aldermen present were Messers. R.P. Andrews, J.M. Cheek, G.M. Braune and H.A. Whitfield.

Mayor Roberson being out of town, a motion was made by Alderman R.P. Andrews, seconded by Alderman G.M. Braune, duly passed, making Alderman H.A. Whitfield Mayor Pro tem. to serve in Mayor Roberson's absence during the remainder of the term.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion duly passed the Town Business Manager was instructed to find out how many persons owning houses within 300 feet of a water line and 200 feet of a sewer line were not financially able to connect with same; and to propose some method of financing same.

Upon motion duly passed the Town Business Manager was instructed to confer with Town Attorney A.C. McIntosh in regard to a new schedule of license and privilege taxes.

The Manager presented a report on the Budget showing the "expenditures" and "appropriations" to December 1, 1923, end of the first six months of the fiscal year. The actual expenses exceed the appropriations at this time, but further calculations show a cash balance of \$753.00.

The Town Business Manager reported that he was ready to appoint a successor to W.W. Woods, resigned. However, the man in mind did not feel that he purchase the motorcycle and pay all the costs of maintenance and operation for the salary of \$150.00 per month. A motion was made and duly passed to allow this officer \$10.00 per month out of his fees for the maintenance of the machine. It was the sense of the Board that it preferred for he Town to own the motorcycle if it could be paid for and operated out of the \$150.00 per month and the fees. A motion was made and duly passed instructing the Town Business Manager to confer with the Official of the University and get their consent to use a portion of the money they are willing to pay for this work towards the purchase of a motorcycle; and to purchase same if a satisfactory arrangement can be made for the payment of the cost and upkeep of the machine.

Alderman J.M. Cheek, Chairman of the Cemetery Committee, requested the Board of Aldermen to appropriate the sum of \$50.00 for beautifying the old section of the Colored Cemetery. Upon motion of Alderman R.P. Andrews, seconded by Alderman J.M. Cheek, duly passed, the sum of \$50.00 was appropriated for this purpose, the work to be done under the direction of Alderman Cheek and the Town Business Manager.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 10:30 P.M.
