There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill at 7:45 P.M., Mayor Roberson Presiding.

The Aldermen present were Messers B.M.Braune, J.M.Cheek, and D.D.Carroll.

The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman G.M. Braune, duly passed, the Town Business Manager was instructed to investigate and recommend an alarm system for the police by which communication may be established with them.

The promiscuous throwing of hand bills on the streets was then brought up for discussion and upon motion of Alderman D.D. Carroll seconded by Alderman J.M.Cheek the following ordinance was duly passed, all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor; the said ordinance being as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That the promiscuous throwing of hand bills and advertising sheets in sufficient quantities to be a nuisance is strictly forbidden.

Section 2. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict here with are hereby repealed.

Section 3. Any person violating any part of this ordinance shall be subject to a fine of \$5.00 for each offense.

The question of the Town Government paying a portion of the salary of the Nurse for the Colored People was brought up for consideration. Upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman G.M.Braune this matter was referred to the Board of Health for their recommendation.

The question of the Sewer Disposal Plant was brought up for discussion, and upon motion the manager was instructed to write to several engineers throughout the state in regard to their fee for a job of this nature and the service they can give.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 9 P.M.

There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill at 12 noon, Mayor Roberson presiding.

The aldermen present were Messers. R.P.Andrews, G.M.Braune, D.D.Carroll and J.M.Cheek.

The question of allowing the BANK OF CHAPEL HILL TO ENCROACH UPON THE SIDEWALK WITH THE DECORATIVE FEATURES OF THEIR BUILDING was brought up for discussion by Alderman D.D.Carroll. Upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman G.M.Braune the following resolution was duly passed, all the Aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor; to-wit, Aldermen R.P. Andrews, G.M.Braune, D.D.Carroll and J.M.Cheek; said resolution being as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Whereas, there appears to have been some misunderstanding between the Officials of the Bank of Chapel Hill and their architect in regard to the decorative features of their new building front;

Whereas, if the building be set back so that the decorative features be on the building line, the main body of the building would be eight inches within said building line;

Whereas, it appears from an inspection of the plans that the general appearance of the building would be enhanced by allowing the decorative features to project as shown by the accompanying sketch;

Whereas, the Board of Aldermen recognizes the fact that they have no right to grant permission for a permanent encroachment on any street or sidewalk;

And whereas, any other Board of Aldermen in the future may require the removal of the encroachment;

THAT no objection is made by the present Board of Aldermen to the completion of the repairs to the Bank of Chapel Hill Building as specified in the accompanying sketch. Said specifications showing encroachments on the sidewalk of 6 inches by a decorative moulding at the base of the building, 8 inches by a decorative door pilaster, and 8½ inches by a door step.

The Board of Aldermen adjourned at 12:30 P.M.
