

22 April 1924

There was a meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill at 7:45 P.M., Mayor Roberson presiding.

The Aldermen present were Messers: R.P.Andrews, G.M.Braune, D.D.Carroll and H.A.Whitfield.

The minutes of five previous meetings were read and approved.

Mr. C.T.Woolen, Business Manager of the University of North Carolina, met with the Board in regard to the Sewer Disposal Plant for the Town and the University. Mr. Woolen stated that this matter should be brought before the Building Committee of the Board of Trustees at their meeting on May 1st. The Mayor appointed Mr. G.M.Braune to present this matter to the Building and to ask them to agree to pay one-half the cost of the Disposal Plant.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL TO ISSUE \$2,400.00 of SEWER BONDS was then brought up for consideration, and upon motion of Alderman D.D.Carroll seconded by Alderman G.M. Barune was duly passed, all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor, to-wit: Aldermen R.P.Andrews, G.M.Braune, D.D. Carroll, and H.A.Whitfield; said ordinance being as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That under the authority contained in the Municipal Finance Act, the Town of Chapel Hill does issue its bonds for the purpose of extending the present existing Sewer System in and for the said Town.

Section 2. That the maximum aggregate principal amount of the said bonds shall be \$2,400.00

Section 3. That a tax sufficient to pay the principal and the interest of the said bonds shall be annually levied and collected.

Section 4. That a statement of the debt of the municipality has been filed with the Clerk pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and is now open to public inspection.

Section 5. The average assessed valuation of the property subject to taxation by the municipality for the three fiscal years in which taxes were last levied as shown by the said statement is \$2,055,397.00.

Section 6. That the amount of the net debt of the municipality outstanding, authorized, or to be authorized as shown by said statement is \$33,451.48.

Section 7. That this ordinance shall take effect thirty days after its first publication unless in the meantime a petition for its submission to the voters of the municipality is filed with the Clerk under the Municipal Finance Act, and in such event it shall take effect when approved by the voters at an election as provided for in the Municipal Finance Act of 1921 and amendments thereto.

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The following certificate of the sufficiency of a petition from the property owners for the construction of curbs and gutters on Rosemary Lane was presented to the Board by the Clerk.

ORANGE COUNTY

There having been lodged with me a petition asking that certain local improvements be done on Rosemary Lane, from Boundary Street Westward along Rosemary Lane to Hillsboro Street, said improvements to consist of placing curb and gutters along each side of said street within the limits designated, and having duly investigated the sufficiency of said petition as set out in Chapter 56, entitled, "An Act Relating to Local Improvements in Municipalities", Public Laws of North Carolina, Session 1915, and it appearing that more than fifty-one per centum of the abutting property owners representing more than fifty-one per centum of the frontage in said district have signed the said petition, I hereby certify that the said petition is sufficient in all respects and complies with the act above referred to.

On motion of Alderman G.M.Braune seconded by Alderman D.D.Carroll the petition was accepted and the Town Manager was instructed to make all necessary surveys and plans for the construction of the curb and gutter and submit same to the Board of Aldermen at a later meeting.

AN ORDINANCE TO AUTHORIZE THE PURCHASE OF AN ALARM OR COMMUNICATION SYSTEM FOR THE POLICE was then brought up for consideration and upon motion of Alderman H.A.Whitfield seconded by Alderman R.P.Andrews was duly passed, all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor, the said ordinance being as follows:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

Section 1. That the Town Manager is hereby authorized to purchase and install four outside telephones with alarm gongs for the use of the police.

Section 2. That the cost of the said telephones shall not exceed \$60.00 each.

THE QUESTION OF ZONING ORDINANCES FOR CHAPEL HILL was brought up for discussion and upon motion of Alderman R.P.Andrews seconded by Alderman D.D.Carroll, Aldermen G.M.Braune and H.A.Whitfield were designated as a committee to consider this question and to report to the Board at a later meeting.

The Board adjourned at 10 P.M.
