Minutes of Meeting of Board of Aldermen, Town of Chapel Hill, August 13, 1930.

The regular monthly meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Twon Office, at 8:00 P. M. o'clock, August 13th, 1930, Mayor Council presiding, with the following aldermen present: Messrs. Hogan, Burch, Braune, Connor, Thompson and Eubanks, and Town Attorney Sawyer was also present.

Visators present were Messrs Louis Graves, Mr. Hoyle, Supt. of Schools, and Mr. Scott of the Insurance Agency.

The minutes of the meetings of July 10th, July 23rd and August 8th were read and approved.

The Manager read the Budget for the year 1930-1931 as approved by the Budget Committee, and left for the public's inspection prior to July 30th, 1930. The Manager stated that a notice as follows was published in the August 1st, 1930 issue of the Chapel Hill Weekly, a newspaper published in Orange County:

LEGAL NOTICE:

"Final action on the Town Budget for 1930-31 will be taken at a meeting of the Board of Aldermen on Wednesday, August 13th, 1930. A copy of the Budget is now on file with the Clerk at The Town Office for public inspection."

After some discussion, Alderman Thompson moved the adoption of the Budget as approved by the Budget Committee. Alderman Braune seconded the motion, and the Budget was adopted by a unanimous vote of the alderman present. (See next page for copy of the Budget)

The Manager stated that the Town's request for \$2500.00 for Street Improvement had been approved by the State Sinking Fund Commission, and that the request for \$35,000.00 for Sewer Plant Improvement was now pending before the State Sinking Fund Commission.

The subject of levying the Tax Rate for 1930-31 was brought up for discussion. The Manager stated that the total valuation of property as listed from the new scroll was \$3,680,000.00. Upon motion of Alderman Connor, seconded by Alderman Eubanks, the following resolution was duly adopted, - all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

Section 1. That the Town Tax Rate for 1930 shall be 92¢ per \$100.00 valuation of property as shown below, - Town Operation 53¢, Town Bonds 39¢, - Total Town Tax 92¢.

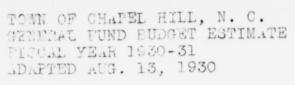

General and Sinking Fund Budgets

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Aldermen, Town of Chapel Hill, August 13, 1930.

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Mr. C. A. Hoyle, Secretary to the Board of Trustees of Chapel Hill School District, was present, and stated that the present School District embraced the entire city limits, and also territory outside of the Town Limits, as voted by citizens at the last election for the schools. The valuation of the property in the School District of Chapel Hill is \$3,680,000.00, while the valuation of the District outside of Chapel Hill is \$650,000.00. The School Trustees recommend that the same rate apply to the entire School District, and requested a tax rate for operation purposes of 40¢, with a rate of Debt Service 8¢, - Total School Rate 48¢.

Upon motion of Alderman Connor, seconded by Alderman Eubanks, the request of the School Trustees was granted.

The total rate for Town and School for 1930-31, is \$1.40 per \$100.00 of valuation of property.

The Manager stated that Mrs. Sallie Hemphill had been charged \$6.00 for sewer rent on a lavatory in an office formerly used by Dr. Hemphill. Upon motion of Alderman Burch, seconded by Alderman Hogan, it was moved that the Manager refund Mrs. Hemphill the sewer rent of \$6.00. All the Alderman present voting in the affirmative therefor.

Upn motion of Alderman Connor, seconded by Alderman Hogan, it was moved that the Mayor write to Mr. John Foister of the Fire Department, expressing the sympathy of the Board for his recent illness.

The Manager read the following letter from Mr. Victor Bryant and Mr. L. J. Phipps, attorneys for Messrs Jack Sparrow and M. Martindale,:-

Durham, N. C. July 25, 1930.

Town of Chapel Hill, Chapel Hill, N. C.

Gentlemen:

We represent Mr. Jack W. Sparrow and Mr. C. L. Martindale, whose property has been greatly damaged by the foul odors from your disposal plant. They have requested you on numerous occasions to remedy the situation. The situation has become worse rather than better. Mr. Sparrow feels that his damage amounts to \$12,500.00 and Mr. Martindale feels that his amounts to \$5,000. Please advise us whether or not you will entertain these claims.

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After much discussion, and upon motion of Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Burch, it was moved that both of these claims be rejected, and that Town Attorney Sawyer be instructed to so advise Attorneys Bryant and Phipps. All the Alderman present voting in the affirmative therefor.

Mayor Council suggested that Mr. Sandy Graham of Hillsboro, and Mr. McLendon of Durham, be retained if it becomes necessary to fight the suit.

Upon motion of Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Connor, it was moved that the public town office hours be from 9:00 to 3:00 P. M. daily, and on Saturday from 9:00 to 5:00 P. M. All the aldermen present voted in the affirmative therefor. This change of hours was deemed necessary in order to allow more time for clerical work.

Upon motion of Alderman Burch, seconded by Alderman Connor, it was moved that Mayor Council appoint Alderman Hogan to make a study of a book-keeping machine for the town office, and make a report. All the Alderman present voted in the affirmative therefor. Mayor ouncil appointed Mr. Hogan to this commission.

Upon motion of Alderman Braune, seconded by Alderman Burch, it was moved that the City Manager be appointed to make a study of the signal situation on Frank-lin Street, and make recommendations to the Board. All aldermen present voted in the affirmative therefor.

Upon motion of Alderman Bubanks, seconded by Alderman Connor, the following Ordinance was introduced, all the aldermen present voting in the affirmative therefor:

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN, TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL:

- Section 1, That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm, or corporation to sell or offer for sale any fruits, vegetables, or any other farm or garden products; any goods, wares, or merchandise of any name or description on the streets or sidewalks of Franklin Street between Columbia and Henderson Streets, or within one hundred feet of the intersection of Columbia and Franklin Streets on Columbia Street.
- Section 2, Any person, firm, or corporation violating this Ordinance shall be fined, not exceeding Fifty Dollars (\$50.00) or imprisoned not exceeding Thirty Days (30).

This the 13th day of August, 1930.
