

Minutes of the Meeting of the Board of Aldermen, Town of Chapel Hill, Mar. 14, 1934.

Book 6, Page 278.

The regular Meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Town Office at 8 o'clock P. M., March 14, 1934. Present were Mayor J. M. Foushee, Alderman M. E. Hogan, C. L. Eubanks, J. T. Dobbins, R. D. W. Connor and P. L. Burch; also present were Town Accountant L. B. Rogerson and Town Attorney B. D. Sawyer.

The following subjects were brought up and handled as indicated below.

Subject: Slot Machines in the Town of Chapel Hill.

The Town Manager stated that there were four slot machines being operated in town. After a thorough discussion, the board authorized the City Manager to write the solicitor and ask his assistance in prohibiting the use of slot machines in the Town of Chapel Hill. On motion of Alderman Eubanks, seconded by Alderman Dobbins the Town Attorney was authorized to draw up an ordinance prohibiting the use of punch boards and slot machines in the town.

Subject: Collection of Delinquent Taxes.

The City Manager stated that Mr. Rogerson had said that the University would lend the town the assistance of a bookkeeper for several months to help work out a plan whereby the people could make monthly payments on their taxes; and to assist in the general office work. On motion of Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Connor the board accepted the assistance of the bookkeeper with thanks.

Subject: Ordinance Prohibiting People from Driving Cars over the Sidewalks.

The City Manager read the above ordinance as submitted by the Town Attorney. The Board authorized the Town Attorney to change the Ordinance to read "Prohibiting the driving of cars over any sidewalks in Chapel Hill". Also change the fines to be not less than \$5.00 and more than \$50.00. On motion of Alderman Eubanks, seconded by Alderman Dobbins the above ordinance was adopted as amended by the board and made a part of these minutes.

Subject: Ordinance Prohibiting the Tearing up of Concrete Streets.

The City Manager read the above Ordinance as submitted by the Town Attorney and on motion of Alderman Burch, seconded by Alderman Hogan the ordinance was adopted with the amendment of the fine to
