On motion of M. E. Hogan, seconded by B. S. Thompson and unanimously passed by the Board the following tax rates were set for the Town Operation and Debt Service on each \$100.00 worth of real and personal property.

Current Operation .8
Debt Service .2

On motion of R. D. W. Connor, seconded by C. L. Eubanks and passed unanimously by the Board the rate per \$100.00 worth of real and personal property for the use of the Chapel Hill Graded School was set as follows:

For debt service, on each \$100.00 worth of real and personal property 13.5 For supplement State fund, on each \$100.00 worth of real and personal property 18.5 Special for current operations and expenses, on each \$100.00 worth of real and personal property 2.0 Total of 34.0 on each \$100.00 worth of real and personal property 34.0
