

Minutes of Meeting held June 5, 1935.

There was a called meeting of the Board of Aldermen held at the Town Hall at 8 o'clock P. M., June 5, 1935. Mayor J. M. Foushee presided and the following Aldermen were present: Messrs. J. T. Dobbins, M. E. Hogan, P. L. Burch, C. L. Eubanks and R. H. Wettach.

The purpose of this meeting was to hear Dr. C. S. Mangum outline a plan to set up a Federal Assisted Health Unit at Chapel Hill taking in all of Orange, Caswell and Person Counties under the direction of a Major Officer, with necessary assistants, and for a complete unit to be established for each of the three counties named. The general plan, showing the tentative budget for carrying on the work, is herewith enclosed as part of these minutes and reference to this will give any necessary information as to details of the plan. It was decided that, in view of the fact that the Orange County Commissioners stated that they could give only \$2,500.00 of the allotted \$3,600.00 shown in this plan, some effort will be made to get the County Commissioners to raise this appropriation and Alderman Hogan was asked to take whatever steps he deemed advisable toward this end. The result of his efforts to be reported to the Regular Board Meeting June 12. No definite action was taken as to the financial participation of the Town of Chapel Hill in this plan, but decisions were deferred until the next meeting.

Subject: Sewer Line.

At this meeting Professor Wager, L. M. Brooks and with Mr. Wettach, who is interested in that project, appeared in behalf of the property owners in South West Chapel Hill and surrounding territory just out of the City limits with reference to constructing a sewer system through the PWA plan. The board decided that there were quite a lot of details to be worked out in connection with this plan of constructing this sewer line and it would be necessary to get some sort of guarantee of income from the property owners who would consent to connecting to this system. The full matter to be closely studied and to be taken up at a later date, however, it is shown in succeeding pages of these minutes that application is being presented to the PWA authorities for \$9,000, the amount necessary to complete the project.

Subject: Federal Works Projects.

The committee which met on June 4, at the Bank of Chapel Hill composed of Mayor J. M. Foushee, Aldermen M. E. Hogan, R. H. Wettach, J. T. Dobbins and P. L. Burch were requested to report their findings. It was stated that details of certain projects contemplated by the Town of Chapel Hill under the PWA plan were discussed and the following schedule of projects in order were recommended to the board at this meeting.

1. Street work
2. Incinerator
3. Sewer construction South West in the city limits and just beyond
4. Municipal Building; Fire Station and Jail combined.

It was decided that application shall be made for these projects as scheduled and that the amount of money asked for in each case as below.

| 3. Sewer construction South West of Chapel Hill | 9,000.    |

The schedule was passed by the Board on motion as follows:

1. Motion was made by Alderman R. H. Wettach, seconded by P. L. Burch.
2. Motion was made by Alderman M. E. Hogan, seconded by Alderman J. T. Dobbins. (It was decided that Alderman M. E. Hogan should see the authorities of the University of N. C., with the view of obtaining assistance in the construction of the incinerator)
3. Motion was made by Alderman C. L. Eubanks, seconded by Alderman R. H. Wettach.
4. Motion was made by Alderman P. L. Burch, seconded by Alderman M. E. Hogan.

Subject: Traffic Situation.

The question of traffic situation was discussed and motion was made by Alderman P. L. Burch, seconded by Alderman J. T. Dobbins that parking on East Franklin Street from the stop light to Henderson Street for a period of more than two hours is to be prohibited, between the hours of 8 A. M., and 7 P. M., each week day, Sundays to be excepted. It was included in this motion that the traffic lines should be remarked at the same angle, but six inches closer together.

Subject: Employment of Engineer for PWA Work.

The Town Manager asked that the Board give him the authority to engage a full time engineer and designer to be selected for all engineering features and supervision of the work projects contemplated under the PWA plan and any other that is decided upon by the board during duration of the work. On motion of Alderman R. H. Wettach, seconded by Alderman M. E. Hogan, Mr. A. R. Hollett who is now on the city pay roll be offered this place at \$150.00 per month (in addition to his present wages for services to the town) for a guaranteed period of two months. After which, if the work is to be continued to such a length of time as later decided upon, he shall be retained under the above conditions.

There being no further business, the Meeting of the Board of Aldermen adjourned.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMAN OF THE TOWN  
OF CHAPEL HILL

SECTION I

That it shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation to park an automobile or other motor vehicle on East Franklin Street from Columbia Street to Henderson Street for a period of time in excess of two hours between the hours of 8:00 a. m. to 7:00 p. m. each week-day, Sundays to be excepted.

SECTION II

Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall be punished as provided by the State Law for violation of municipal ordinances.
