There was a called meeting of the Board of Aldermen held in the Town Hall at 8 o'clock P. M., November 1, 1935. Mayor J. M. Foushee presided and the following Aldermen were present: C. L. Eubanks, J. T. Dobbins, R. H. Wettach and R. J. M. Hobbs. The following members of the school board were also present; Carl Durham, Collier Cobb and R. J. M. Hobbs.

The purpose of this meeting was to elect two trustee for the School Board jointly with the Town Board, to succeed Mr. M. E. Hogan and R. E. Coker whose term expired last June. Motion was made by Alderman Eubanks, seconded by Alderman Dobbins and passed that Mr. M. E. Hogan and Eubanks, seconded by Alderman Dobbins and passed that Mr. M. E. At this time Mayor J. M. Foushee stated that Dr. Newsome of the Historical Club had asked that the Town authorize them to place markers in Chapel Hill between the Vance Dormitory and Graham Memorial on East Franklin Street. Motion was made by Alderman Eubanks seconded by Alderman Dobbins and passed that the Mayor be authorized to appoint a committee with the power to act to confer with Dr. Newsome in regard to placing markers on Franklin Street. The Mayor appointed Alderman R. J. M. Hobbs, and C. L. Eubanks to act in that capacity.

There being no further business the Meeting of the Board of Aldermen adjourned.
