

Minutes of Meeting of the Board of Aldermen,  
held December 11, 1935.

Book 6, Page 491.

The regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Town Hall at 8 o'clock P. M., December 11, 1935. Mayor J. M. Foushee presided and the following Aldermen were present: P. L. Burch, R. H. Wettach, R. J. M. Hobbs and M. E. Hogan. Also present were Town Accountant, M. L. Thompson, and Town Attorney, B. D. Sawyer.

The following subjects were brought up and disposed of as indicated:

Minutes of the regular meeting held November 13, were read and approved.

Subject: Publishing Ratings of Cafes, Restaurants and Milk Dairies.

The question of the ratings of the eating places and milk dairies was brought up for discussion, and since the case against J. L. Sutton for operating a Cafe with a rating below 70, as found by the State Board of Health, had been tried in Recorder's Court and later appealed by Mr. Sutton to superior court and postponed from the December term of court to the March term, motion was made by Alderman Wettach, seconded by Alderman Burch and passed that the District Health Department be requested to publish the gradings of all cafes and restaurants and milk dairies.

Subject: Appropriation of \$25.00 for Christmas Decoration on Streets.

Alderman Burch stated that the merchants were asking the town to contribute \$25.00 to the decoration of the streets for Christmas. Motion was made by Alderman Burch, seconded by Alderman Hobbs and passed that the town appropriate \$25.00 to the decoration fund for 1935.

Subject: Dr. Nathan's Bill against the Town.

Alderman Hogan stated that Dr. Nathan had a bill against the town for services in connection with some dogs that had been taken to his hospital probably by the police. Motion was made by Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Burch and passed that the City Manager be instructed to investigate the charge of \$7.50 against the town through the police department to ascertain if the town is liable for the charge and if the town is responsible to inform him that the town will credit the amount of his bill against his taxes due the town for 1934 any time that he is ready to pay the remainder of that tax.

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Subject: Opening Alley way behind Bus Station parallel  
to and South of East Franklin Street.

The City Manager stated that Mr. John McCauley was going to erect a building behind the Bus Station and it would be necessary for the town to open up the alley from the lot that belongs to T. C. Atwood, West of the Model Market out to Columbia Street. Since the property through which the alley should run from T. C. Atwood's property out to Columbia Street belongs to the A. B. Roberson Estate, it would be necessary for the town to get their permission before opening the alley. The City Manager was instructed to take the matter up with Dr. Foy Roberson in Durham and ascertain if the heirs would be willing for the town to open up the alley way through their property out to Columbia Street.

Subject: Light in Alley between the Sutton and Strowd  
Buildings.

The City Manager stated that he felt that there should be a light placed in the alley between the Sutton Building and the Strowd Building on Franklin Street. Motion was made by Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Burch and passed that the matter be referred to the committee on public utilities.

Subject: Suits and Rain Coats for the Fire Department.

The City Manager stated that he had received a request from the Fire Department asking for twelve suits and 8 rain coats to be used by the Fire Department. After it was discussed, motion was made by Alderman Hogan, seconded by Alderman Wettach and passed that the City Manager and Town Accountant be instructed to transfer \$65.00 from the contingent fund to the amount appropriated in the budget for the Fire Department the City Manager stating that there was \$35.00 in the budget for this purpose. The City Manager was instructed to buy eight suits and five rain coats for the Fire Department at a cost of \$15.00 for the suits and \$6.00 for the coats.

There being no further business, the meeting of the Board of Aldermen adjourned.

KNOW ALL MEN BY THESE PRESENTS, that the Town of Chapel Hill in the State of North Carolina, for value received, hereby promises to pay to the bearer at the WACCAMAW BANK & TRUST COMPANY, WHITEVILLE, NORTH CAROLINA, on March 10, 1936, the Principal Sum of SEVENTEEN THOUSAND FIVE HUNDRED AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$17,500.00) with interest at three per cent per annum, payable at maturity.

THIS NOTE IS ISSUED FOR MONEY borrowed for the purpose of meeting appropriations for necessary expenses of said town for the current fiscal year and is within the amount of such appropriation and is issued pursuant to the Municipal Finance Act and a resolution duly adopted by the Board of Aldermen of said town.

IT IS HEREBY CERTIFIED AND RECITED that all acts, conditions, and things required by the laws and Constitution of North Carolina to happen, exist, and be performed precedent to and in the issuance of this Note, have happened, existed, and been performed in regular and due form and time as so required, and that the total indebtedness of the said town, including this note, does not exceed any constitutional or statutory limitations thereon.
