There was a called meeting of the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill, August 27, at 8:00 o'clock P. M., in the Town Hall. J. M. Foushee, Mayor and the following in the Town Hall. J. M. The matter of a successor to be appointed to the vacancy caused by the death of Alderman M. E. Hogan was taken up. Dr. J. S. Hooker came before the Board in regard to the matter of including two additional housekeeping units in the Gore house which he recently purchased. He advanced reasons for the alleged necessity of this. The matter was considered by the Board, and on motion of Alderman R. J. M. Hobbs, seconded by Alderman M. L. Thompson, a resoltuion was passed that if Dr. Alderman M. L. Thompson, a resoltuion was passed that if Dr. Hooker cared to have a public meeting called, the citizens in that section of Chapel Hill would be notified of the public hearing section of Chapel Hill would be notified of the opinion of the to be held in regard to the matter so that the opinion of the people could be heard. Notices were to be placed in prominent locations and letters sent to those citizens most directly interested in that section of Chapel Hill.

The question of over-all garbage collection was discussed and it was decided that the cost of the same be included in the tax rate for the year 1936-37, as per previous plans and estimations.

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Book 6, Page 530.

Motion was made by Alderman M. L. Thompson, seconded by Alderman Burch that the budget be formerly approved and the tax rate be fixed for the fiscal year at 70¢ per \$100.00 valuation for valuation for the general fund and 60¢ per \$100.00 valuation for the debt service fund. At this point a letter was read from the Secretary of the School Board requesting that 35¢ per \$100.00 valuation be adopted for the benefit of the Graded School system of Chapel Hill, on motion of Alderman Hobbs, seconded by Alderman of Chapel Hill, on motion of Alderman Hobbs, seconded by Alderman tax rate, therefore, for all purposes within the incorporate limits of Chapel Hill is established for the fiscal year 1936-37 at \$1.65 per \$100.00 valuation. Alderman Hobbs asked that the Board give consideration to the construction of a sidewalk on the West side of Pittsboro road from the trestle to the new school building and the Mayor asked that the street committee investigate and report to the Board.

Alderman Eubanks representing the committee appointed by the Mayor to request that the Movie Guild appropriate 25% of the gross sunday receipts be given to purposes designated, instead of the 15% as heretofore, reported that Mr. E. C. Smith, Manager of the Carolina Theatre, had agreed to turn over to the Town of Chapel Hill the sum of \$75.00 per month for nine months beginning September 1, the sum of \$75.00 of which was to be paid to the Health Department for 1936, \$30.00 of which was to be paid to the Health Department for the social disease clinic and the balance to be used by the Town Board whereever they deemed it most needed.

There being no further business, the meeting of the Board of Aldermen adjourned.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL.

SECTION 1 Book 6, Page 531.

That all garbage, other than liquids, from residences which is to be collected by the Town of Chapel Hill shall be placed or caused to be placed by the occupant of the house in a metal container with close fitting top of not more than 25 gallon capacity.

Section 11

Said containers shall be placed in such a position that they be reasonably accessible from the street to the garbage collector but in no case shall they be placed on the street or sidewalk.

SECTION 111

Any individual engaged in the hauling of garbage shall first obtain from the City Manager a permit without cost.

SECTION 1V

Any person, firm or corporation violating the terms of this ordinance shall be punished as provided by the State Law for violation of municipal ordinances.
