Special Meeting
Board of Aldermen--Chapel Hill, N. C.
February 19, 1951

A special meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Town Hall on February 19, 1951 at 8:00 P.W.

In the absence of the Mayor, the Mayor Pro-Tem, R. J. M. Hobbs, presided.

Mr. Rose presented a proposed bill for introduction in the North Carolina General Assembly that would amend Chapter 629, Session Laws of 1949, extending the zoning powers of the Town of Chapel Hill four miles beyond the corporate boundaries. Mr. Hobbs explained to the members that this would be merely an enabling act, and that if it were passed, the Board would then have to make its own Ordinances to affect certain sections of the County. This would also mean that the Zoning Commission and the Board of Adjustment would have to be enlarged by three members each. After discussing this bill, Mr. Putnam moved an approval of the bill as prepared and read to the Board and recommended its passage, with a request for Mr. Umstead to introduce it and use his best efforts to secure its passage. This motion was seconded by Mr. Davis and passed unanimously.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED "AN ACT TO AMEND CHAPTER 629, SESSION LAWS OF 1949, EXTENDING THE PLANNING AND ZONING POWERS OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL."

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

Section 1. That Section 1 of Chapter 529 of the Session Laws of 1949 is hereby amended by substituting for the words "for a distance of one mile of and beyond such corporate boundaries in all directions" in lines 21 and 22 of said section the words "for a distance of not more than four (4) miles of and beyond such corporate boundaries in all directions, but not beyond the boundaries of Orange County or within the corporate limits of the Town of Carrboro."

Section 2. That three new sections are hereby added to said Chapter as follows:

"Section 1 1/4. In order to exercise the powers granted in the preceding section, the Governing Body of the Town of Chapel Hill shall create a Zoning Commission Enlarged of the Town of Chapel

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Hill. This Commission shall have authority to exercise the powers, duties, and functions of a zoning or planning commission with respect to ordinances, regulations, maps and plans only insofar as they are applicable, or proposed to be applicable, to the said territory outside and beyond the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill, as defined in this Act. This Commission shall be composed of all members of the Town Planning Board of the Town of Chapel Hill, as now or hereafter constituted according to statute, and three (3) additional members who shall be appointed by the Orange County Board of Commissioners.

Each such additional member shall be a citizen and resident of said territory beyond and surrounding the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill, as defined by this Act. The additional members shall be appointed for terms beginning within thirty (30) days after the ratification of Act, one for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of three years, and until their respective successors shall have been appointed and qualified; thereafter the appointment of such additional members shall be for terms of three years, and until their respective successors shall have been appointed and qualified. The chairman and the secretary of the Town Planning Board shall hold those offices, ex officio, on the Zoning Commission Enlarged. The laws, ordinances, rules and regulations applicable to the members of the Town Planning Board of the Town of Chapel Hill shall be applicable to the members of the Zoning Commission Enlarged of the Town of Chapel Hill. For all other purposes, except as herein specifically provided, the membership, powers, duties, and functions of the Town Planning Board of the Town of Chapel Hill shall be and remain as constituted by the Charter of the Town of Chapel Hill and by the General Statutes of North Carolina applicable thereto, and except as herein specifically provided, the powers, duties and functions of the Town Planning Board of the Town of Chapel Hill, as constituted by law, shall not be affected by the provisions of this Act.

"Section 1 1/2. If a zoning ordinance is adopted for the territory beyond the corporate limits of Chapel Hill, as authorized by this act, three (3) additional members of the Zoning Board of Adjustment of the Town of Chapel Hill, provided for by Section 160-178 of the General Statutes of 1943 as amended, shall be appointed by the Orange County Board of Commissioners.

Each such additional member shall be a citizen and resident of said territory beyond and surrounding the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill, as defined by this Act. The additional members shall be appointed for terms beginning within thrity (30) days after ratification of this Act, one for a term of one year, one for a term of two years, and one for a term of three years, and until their

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respective successors shall have been appointed and qualified; thereafter, the appointment of such additional members shall be for terms of three years and until their respective successors shall have been appointed and qualified. Such additional members shall exercise their powers and perform their duties as members of said Zoning Board of Adjustment only with respect to said territory beyond and surrounding the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill, as defined by this Act."

Section 1 3/4. The Building Inspector for the Town of Chapel Hill shall also be the Building Inspector of the area or areas zoned under the powers granted by Chapter 629 Session Laws of 1949 and Amendments to that Statute. Appeals from any decision by said Building Inspector shall be made in writing to the Board of Adjustment Enlarged.

Section 3. That Section 2 of Chapter 629 of the Session Laws of 1949 is hereby amended by substituting for the words "for a distance of one mile beyond the same in all directions provided that it shall not extend to any area within the corporate limits of the Town of Carrboro" in lines 5, 6, and 7 of said section the words "for a distance of four (4) miles beyond the same in all directions, but not including any area within the corporate limits of the Town of Carrboro or any area beyond the boundaries of Orange County."

Section 4. That all laws and clauses of laws in conflict with the provisions of this Act are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section 5. That this Act shall be in full force and effect from and after its ratification.

A letter written by Mr. Phillips Russell was read to the Board asking the Board to request the General Assembly to pass a law making Chapel Hill a Bird Sanctuary. Mr. Burch moved that the following Bill be recommended to the General Assembly for passage, sent to Mr. Umstead and requested that he introduce it and secure its passage, if possible. This motion was seconded by Mr. Putnam and unanimously passed.

A BILL TO BE ENTITLED AN ACT TO CREATE A BIRD SANCTUARY WITHIN THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL IN ORALGE COUNTY

The General Assembly of North Carolina do enact:

Section 1. The territory within the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill in Orange County is hereby declared to be a bird sanctuary.

Section 2. It shall be unlawful for any person to kill,

trap, or otherwise take any bird within the corporate limits of the Town of Chapel Hill except English Sparrows, Great Horned Owls, Cooper's Hawks, Sharp-shinned Hawks, Crows, Starlings, Pigeons, and domesticated fowls. Any person violating the provisions of this Section shall be guilty of a misdemeanor and, upon conviction, shall be fined not more than fifty dollars (\$50.00) or imprisoned not more than 30 days.

Section 3. All laws and clauses of laws in conflict with this Act are hereby repealed.

Section 4. This Act shall become effective upon its ratification.

Mr. Hinshaw requested that an Assistant Tax Collector be legally appointed for the Town of Chapel Hill. He maintained that any assistance we have had has been without legal authority and should be legalized. Ar. Fowler moved that we have prepared an Act for passage by the General Assembly authorizing the appointment of an Assistant Tax Collector. This motion was seconded by Mr. Fitch and unanimously passed.

The question of amending Chapter 725, Session Laws of 1947, so as to make possible the levying of municipal taxes on areas annexed between February 1 and November 30, inclusive, on a prorated basis was brought before the members of the Board, but was not acted upon at this meeting.

Mr. Hinshaw brought up the question of letting people living within the jurisdiction of the Chapel Hill Recorder's Court vote for the Judge of the Recorder's Court. After discussing this matter, the Board decided to take this suggestion under advisement.

Mr. Rose reported that Mrs. Wagner, Clerk of the Recorder's Court, was sick and that Mr. W. W. Durham was helping in her absence.

Upon motion of Mr. Eurch, seconded by Mr. Putnam, and unanimous consent, the meeting was adjourned at 9:00 P.M. o'clock.
