Minutes Regular Meeting
Board of Aldermen-Chapel Hill, N. C.
June 11, 1951

The regular meeting of the Board of Adderman was held in the Town Hall on June 11, 1951 at 8:00 P.M.

Present were Mayor Lanier, Aldermen Fitch, Burch, Davis, Cornwell, and Putnam, and Town Manager Rose.

The minutes of the May 28, 1951 meeting were read, and approved, as corrected.

Mr. Rose read three letters from Mr. Jack Lipman, President of the Chapel Hill-Carrboro Merchants Association, requesting that the Town wash West Franklin Street oftener and supply more garbage cans for refuse. Mr. Rose said that the labor force was instructed to wash Franklin Street every Monday, Wednesday, and Friday, and that he would talk to the University about securing some additional garbage cans. Mr. Lipman inquired about what had been done about the merchant's request for better street lighting facilities on West Franklin Street. Mr. Lanier stated that he thought the merchants understood that this matter would have to be considered in making up the budget for 1951-52 as it would be impossible to get it into the 1950-51 budget. Also, Mr. Lipman wanted to know if something could be done to secure additional pedestrian lanes, particularly in the middle of East Franklin Street. This matter was discussed in full, and Mr. Burch moved that the Town Manager be authorized to study this situation and make such recommendations as he sees fit at the next meeting of the Board. This motion was seconded by Mr. Cornwell and passed unanimously.

The Health Department's report for the month of May, 1951 was read by Mr. Rose. This report was turned over to Mr. Putnam, Chairman of the Health Committee, for study. It was suggested that the Town ask for the Health Department's findings in connection with the ditch that flows through Mr.Bush's property on East Rosemary Street.

The Police and Clerk of Court reports for the month of May, 1951 were handed to each member present. Mr. Rose and Judge Stewart were asked to check this report with the Clerk of Court and try to clarify it.

June 11, 1951

Mr. Rose reported that stop signs had been erected on Ransom Street, also, one had been put up at the corner of North and Columbia Streets, and a new sign had been erected on Church and West Rosemary Streets.

Mr. Rose reported that he had talked with Mr. L. H. Gunter, District Engineer, in regard to Chapel Hill's balance in the City Code Fund and that Mr. Gunter stated that he would put through a request that \$11,000 be used for paving streets in Chapel Hill.

Mr. Lanier stated that he though Mr. Fowler was busy making preparations for a meeting of the North Carolina Food Dealer's Association to be held soon in Raleigh, North Carolina, and was, therefore, unable to attend this meeting.

Mr. Burch stated that Mr. J. Hampton Rich's property behind Carr Street had partially burned and that he and Fire Chief Perry and Mr. Boone had been by to look at it, and that they thought the building should be condemned. He stated that it was a fire hazard and a health hazard. Mr. Burch asked that the Health Department be requested to go and survey the situation and report to the Board its findings, and also that the Electrical Inspector be asked to inspect the property and make his report and recommendations to the Board.

Mr. Putnam requested that the Town look into the matter of people letting shrubs and trees grow up at a corner, making it impossible for drivers to have a safe view of approaching cars.

Chief Sloan stated that the State ABC wine licensing representative was not going to give a favorable report to the application of Robert Lee Freeman for a permit to sell wine. He stated that the beer representative had not been here, but for the Board to wait until he had a chance to consult with him before acting on the permit.

Mr. Cornwell reported that after his inspection of the Negro Recreation Center, he would not approve appropriation of any money for new work until they had taken better care of their present space. He was under the impression that they were not using to full advantage the space that they now have. Mr. Cornwell suggested that Mr. Rose advise the Operation Committee of the Board's inspection of the building, findings, and impression of the upkeep of the building. Also, that a carbon copy of the letter be sent to the Recreation Commission.

June 11, 1951

Mr. Fitch asked that the Town Attorney present the situation as to the Town's ownership and maintenance of this property to the Attorney General, asking about the Town's legal status in appropriating money for maintenance.

When the question of the ditch running near Mitchell Lane was brought up, Mr. Rose was asked to make a survey to determine what waste water is being discharged into this ditch. Mr. Fitch asked that the Town Attorney find out what responsibility the Town has in cleaning up around a ditch, and what authority the Town has in seeing that it is done.

Mr. Rose led a preliminary discussion on the proposed budget for 1951-52.

Mr. Lanier reminded the members of the Board that at the June 25th meeting the Board should elect or re-elect the following municipal officials for 1951-52: Town Manager and Tax Collector, Town Clerk and Treasurer, Auditor, Town Attorney, Chief of Folice, Chief of Fire Department, Clerk of Court, and Prosecuting Attorney.

Mr. Lanier also reminded the members of the Board that at the June 25th meeting, they would have to elect two persons to succeed Dr. J. T. Dobbins and Mr. B. W. Clark on the Board of Adjustment, and elect with the School Board members two persons to serve as members of the School Board for six year terms to succeed Dr. E. W. Knight and Mrs. R. H. Wettach.

Judge Stewart, who visited with the Board at this meeting, expressed pleasure in being a visitor and encouraged the members to visit the Chapel Hill Recorder's Court.

Upon motion of Mr. Davis, seconded by Mr. Putnam, and unanimous consent, the meeting adjourned at 11:10 P.M.
