

MINUTES

Board of Aldermen

Town of Chapel Hill, N. C.

September 13, 1954

The Board of Aldermen met in Regular session September 13, 7:30 P.M. in the Town Hall, with the following present: Mayor Lanier; Aldermen Davis, Wager, Robinson, Cornwell, and Putnam; and Town Manager Rose. Alderman Burch was absent due to illness and Town Attorney was out of State.

The following business was considered:

MINUTES for the August 23, 1954, Regular Meeting were read, corrected, and adopted.

A PETITION FOR CURB AND GUTTER ON MCDADE STREET was read and referred to the Finance Committee, the lack of available funds preventing immediate consideration of the petition.

A BEER and WINE PERMIT was granted Harry Macklin to operate at 171 E. Franklin Street in what has for several years past been the Campus Cafe.

The CAMPUS CAFE'S REQUEST FOR REBATE OF 10/12 of 1954-55 PRIVILEGE LICENSES CHARGES because of closing the business was denied for lack of Statutory authority for such rebate.

REFUND OF PRIVILEGE LICENSES erroneously charged W. B. Glenn Oil Company of Carrboro, N. C. for 1951-52 and 1952-53 was authorized.

LETTERS OF APPRECIATION were read from Benjamin F. Swalin for Town of Chapel Hill's appropriation to the North Carolina Symphony, under authority of Senate Bill #251 (1953) and the first municipal appropriation in North Carolina to the Symphony, and from Frederick N. Cleveland, for his appointment by this Board to membership on the Town Planning Board.

MONTHLY REPORTS were considered from the Health Department, Police Department, and Clerk of Court for the month of August.

CURB and GUTTER ASSESSMENT ROLLS for 1954 installations on the following streets were adopted: Woodland Avenue, Dogwood Drive, Westwood Drive, S. Graham Street, N. Graham Street, N. Roberson Street, Lindsay Street, Roosevelt Drive, and Hillview.

The adopted rolls are attached hereto as a part of these minutes.

ORDINANCE. An Ordinance providing for the opening, use, and maintenance of the new Chapel Hill Cemetery on the Durham Road east of Chapel Hill was unanimously adopted by the Board, and a copy of the Ordinance is attached hereto and incorporated herein as a part of these minutes.

DOGS. An editorial from the August 30, Greensboro Daily News concerning Boxer dogs was read. The Board expressed its' positive desire that all Ordinances concerning dogs in Chapel Hill be vigorously and impartially enforced by the Police Department; also, that all Ordinances concerning dogs be studied for needed amendments.

GARBAGE DISPOSAL for Glen Lennox Development, Inc., was discussed. It was voted to answer the inquiry from Glen Lennox Development, Inc., about garbage disposal privilege at the Town's disposal site, as follows: "The charge would be \$75.00 a month for a maximum of six (6) packer-truck loads a week for a trial period of three (3) months; the Glen Lennox Development to deliver the garbage to the disposal site under the supervision of the Town Manager."

LONE PINE ROAD. The Board not to accept as a municipal street Lone Pine Road as of this date.

USE OF JAIL. The Board adopted a letter to the Town of Carrboro, asking Carrboro to provide jail facilities for its' prisoners, other than in the Chapel Hill jail, after January 1, 1955. Copy of the letter is attached hereto as a part of these minutes.

MISCELLANEOUS:

Mr. Rose reported it would cost about \$1.50 per square yard to have the Volley Ball Court at the Negro Recreation Center paved, with the Town doing the preparatory grading. No action taken.

On motion of Alderman Wager, the Board voted to invite the Planing Board to join the Board of Aldermen in a tour of the Town concerning zoning needs.

Alderman Putnam asked that the need for limited parking on Ransom Street be considered soon.

Upon Motion by Alderman Davis, seconded by Alderman Cornwell and unanimous consent the meeting was adjourned at 10:00 o'clock P.M.

After hearing the minutes for the meeting of September 13, 1954 read on motion made by Alderman [redacted], seconded by Alderman [redacted] the minutes were approved by vote of the Board of Aldermen this 27th day of September, 1954.

The Law

AN ORDINANCE TO PROVIDE FOR THE OPENING AND MAINTENANCE OF CHAPEL HILL CEMETERY.

*Bec't Ordained by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:*

SECTION I

That the Town of Chapel Hill shall open, operate and maintain a cemetery on the property purchased by the Town from Dr. Foy Robertson, Locality and located South of the Chapel Hill-Durham highway at a point east of the Town of Chapel Hill.

SECTION II

That the name of said cemetery shall be \_\_\_\_\_

SECTION III

The Master Map of the affected area, prepared by R. D. Tilson, Landscape Architect and Engineer, dated July 1st, 1910, a copy of which is on file in the office of the Town Manager and identified by the official signatures of the Mayor, Town Clerk and Town Manager, with the official seal of the Municipality attached, which map is hereby incorporated herein as a part of this ordinance, is hereby adopted as the official Map or Plan for development of the entire cemetery area and the provisions of said Master Map shall be adhered to in the development of the cemetery.

SECTION IV

The Detail Maps for Sections A, B & C of the Master Map or Plan, which Detail Maps were also prepared by R. D. Tilson, Landscape Architect and Engineer, are hereby incorporated herein as a part of this ordinance and are hereby adopted as the official Maps or Plans of Sections A, B & C of said cemetery, and the provisions of said Detail Maps shall be adhered to in the development of said sections. A copy of each of said Detail Maps is on file in the office of the Town Manager, identified by the official signatures of the Mayor, Town Clerk and Town Manager, with the official seal of the Municipality attached.

### SECTION V

The area designated as Section A on the Detail Map referred to in Section IV above shall be reserved and used only for interment of members of the Negro race. The areas designated as Section ~~B~~ & C on said Detail Map shall be reserved and used ~~only~~ for interment of ~~other~~ members of ~~the white~~ races. All sections of the cemetery shall be maintained equally and shall afford equal facilities.

### SECTION VI

Fee Simple title to the property included in the cemetery area shall remain vested in the Town of Chapel Hill. There shall be no conveyance of title to any grave space, but the right or privilege of interment shall be sold as herein provided and such right or privilege shall be evidenced by a certificate issued in the name of the Municipality by the Town Manager.

### SECTION VII

The cost of each grave space shall be \$ 40.00, to each purchaser who, at the time of purchase, resides within the corporate limits of the municipality or who owns real estate within the municipality although residing outside the corporate limits. The cost of each grave space to nonresidents of the municipality who do not own real estate within the corporate limits at the time of purchase shall be \$ 80.00. The cost of grave space shall be determined as of the time of purchase and subsequent extension of the corporate limits or subsequent change in the residence or property ownership status of a purchaser shall not cause an increase or decrease in <sup>the</sup> charge paid for grave space. The cost of each grave space shall be paid to the Town in cash before interment. No grave space shall be reserved or allocated except upon payment therefor in cash. The charges hereinabove set forth do not include the cost of opening and closing graves.

### SECTION VIII

The purchaser of interment or burial rights or privileges may not transfer the same. The Town of Chapel Hill will refund, without

interest, any sum paid for interment privileges if requested to do so in writing by the purchaser thereof prior to the opening of a grave in the grave space purchased and upon surrender by the purchaser of the interment or burial privilege certificate issued for such grave space. Upon the death of the holder of a burial or interment privilege certificate, his or her heirs, legatees or devisees, shall succeed to his rights in said certificates. The owner of a burial or interment privilege certificate may permit interment in the grave space or spaces therein described of any person designated in writing by the certificate owner, provided no compensation for such interment is received by the certificate owner and provided the interment is made in compliance with the provisions of the Master Map and the Detail Map hereinabove referred to.

#### SECTION IX

An alphabetical list of purchasers of interment privilege certificates and a section-numerical list of grave spaces sold shall be kept on file in the Town Hall by the Town Manager or such other Municipal officer as the Board of Aldermen may designate.

#### SECTION X

No grave shall be opened and no interment shall be made without a written permit issued by the Town Manager, or other Municipal officer as designated by the Board of Aldermen, and such permit shall be secured at least eight hours prior to opening of a grave. Application for permit to open a grave must be made in writing by the owner of a burial space certificate if living or by a relative of a deceased owner for interment of a deceased owner. Said application shall state the name, age, sex, race and date and place of death of the person to be interred.

#### SECTION XI

All markers in the cemetery shall be of bronze and of a uniform size and design as designated by the Board of Aldermen. No markers or flower vases may be above the ground level. No planting of trees,

shrubbery, flowers, or other decoration shall be permitted in the cemetery except by or under the direction of the Town Manager and in accordance with the Master Plan Map, or amendments to the Master Plan Map. No walls, markers, trees, shrubbery, ~~flower~~, or any other obstruction shall be permitted in the cemetery, except in areas designated on the Master Plan Map for beautification purposes, the objective being to achieve maintenance without great expense and to insure general attractiveness of the entire cemetery. All graves shall be level with the surrounding area and no mounds shall be allowed.

#### SECTION XII

No grave shall be opened to a depth of less than 5 feet to the bottom thereof. Graves shall be opened and closed only by the funeral director in charge of interment and subject to supervision by the Town Manager but at no cost to the Town.

#### SECTION XIII

No person shall in any way disturb any funeral service in the cemetery or use the cemetery as a playground, loafing or parking place, make loud noises or disturbances of any kind or discharge any firearms, except in connection with military funerals or Memorial Day services, use loud, profane or indecent language, make any indecent exposure of the person or commit any other indecent act in the cemetery. Any person who disturbs the quiet and good order of the cemetery by unnecessary noise or other improper conduct may be removed and upon refusing to leave when notified to do so because of any disturbance, improper conduct or other violation of ordinances or regulations relating to the cemetery, shall be guilty of a misdemeanor.

Except in connection with military funerals and Memorial Day exercises it shall be unlawful to carry firearms in any part of the cemetery. <sup>except by authorized officers</sup>

#### SECTION XIV

No person shall drive any vehicle of any kind in the cemetery except upon the main roads and avenues provided therein for vehicular traffic. Horseback riding and the use of bicycles or motorcycles is

prohibited. No person shall drive or lead any horse or horse-driven vehicle in any cemetery faster than a walk or drive any motor vehicle at a rate of speed exceeding 10 miles per hour. No commercial vechicle shall be driven in the cemetery except in the conduct of business connected with proper use of the cemetery. No person shall take any dog or other animal into the cemetery or allow any animal to run at large therein.

#### SECTION XV

It shall be unlawful for any person to enter or leave the cemetery except at the proper places provided for entrance and exist. No person shall enter the cemetery except during the hours in which it is open to the public as herein provided, except by permission from the Town Manager. Between the first day of April and the first day of October of every year, the cemetery shall remain open to the public from seven o'clock, A. M., to seven o'clock P. M; at other times the cemetery shall remain open to the public from seven-thirty o'clock, A. M. to five o'clock, P. M; provided, that ~~the Town Manager may order it closed when in his opinion an emergency exists which necessitates closing.~~ <sup>any deviation from</sup> ~~the Town Manager~~ <sup>to show</sup> ~~when~~

#### SECTION XVI

It shall be unlawful for any person, in any manner, to disturb any grave, deface or remove any grave marker or to damage any flowers, shrubs, trees, or other property in the cemetery. The Town Manager may authorize removal from the cemetery, of any floral designs, flowers, weeds, plants or herbage <sup>of</sup> ~~any kind~~ <sup>when</sup> ~~as soon~~, in his judgment, they become unsightly or if ~~they~~ fail to conform to the standards generally maintained in the cemetery.

#### SECTION XVII

Each and every violation of this ordinance shall be a misdemeanor and punishable as such.

LEGAL NOTICE OF ~~RECEIPT~~ ADOPTING ASSESSMENT ROLL FOR LOCAL IMPROVEMENT IN THE FORM OF CURB AND GUTTER ON WOODLAND AVENUE, DOGWOOD DRIVE, WESTWOOD DRIVE, S. GRAHAM STREET, N. GRAHAM STREET, N. ROBERSON STREET, LINDSAY STREET, ROOSEVELT DRIVE AND HILLVIEW, GIVING NOTICE OF PUBLIC HEARING BEFORE FINAL CONFIRMATION OF ASSESSMENT ROLL:

WHEREAS, on the 29th day of June 1953, the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel, N. C. adopted a resolution ordering the making of local improvement, of curb and gutter, on streets known as WOODLAND AVENUE, DOGWOOD DRIVE, WESTWOOD DRIVE, S. GRAHAM STREET, N. GRAHAM STREET, N. ROBERSON STREET, LINDSAY STREET, ROOSEVELT DRIVE, AND HILLVIEW.

AND WHEREAS, the said improvements have now been completed and the Board of Aldermen has ascertained the total cost thereof and the amount that should be assessed against each lot abutting on said improvements on account of said improvements, and has caused to be prepared an assessment map of the said improvement on which is shown the frontage and location of each lot, together with a notation of the names of the owners thereof as far as can be ascertained; and the said Board of Aldermen has also caused to be prepared an assessment roll on which is entered a brief description of each lot or parcel of land assessed, the amount assessed against each such lot, and the name or names of the owner or owners thereof of each such lot, as far as the same can be ascertained; now therefore,

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF ALDERMEN OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL, N. C.:

Section 1. That the total cost of the improvements specially assessable against abutting lots and parcels of land is hereby determined to be the amount shown therefor on the assessment roll filed with this body.

Section 2. That pursuant to the provisions of the General Statutes of North Carolina, chapter 160, sections 78 to 105, and other applicable provisions thereof, the Board of Aldermen has caused and does hereby cause, an assessment to be made against the lots and parcels of land shown on the assessment map and on the assessment roll.

Section 3. That the assessment roll filed with the Board of Aldermen is hereby adopted as the assessment roll for said improvement.

Section 4. That said assessment roll be, and the same is hereby ordered filed in the office of the Town Clerk for inspection by all parties interested.

Section 5. That September 13, 1954, at 7:30 o'clock p.m. in the Aldermen's Room of the Town Hall be and the same is hereby fixed as the time and place when and where the Board of Aldermen will hear objections to the assessments shown on the assessment roll and to the confirmation of the assessment roll.

Section 6. That this ordinance be published one time in the Chapel Hill Weekly at least ten days prior to the date herein fixed in Section 5 for the public hearing, as notice of the matters herein set out.


Dear Sirs:
