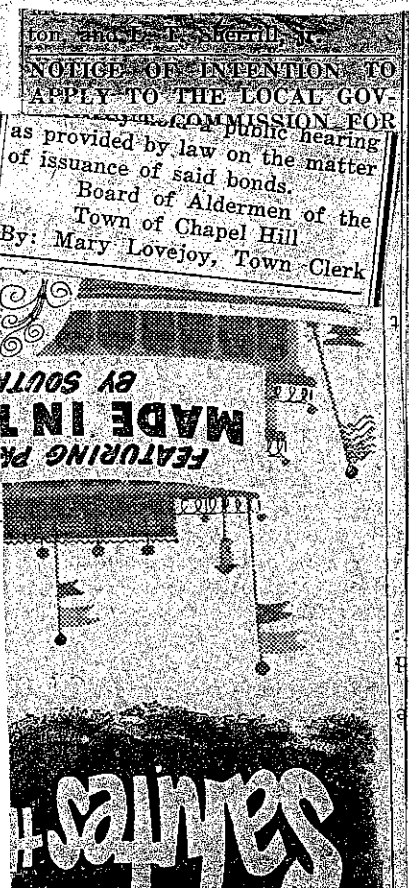

APPLY TO THE LOCAL GOV-
ERNMENT COMMISSION FOR
APPROVAL OF BONDS
NOTICE is hereby given of in-
tention of the undersigned to file
application with the Local Gov-
ernment Commission, Raleigh, N.
C., for its approval of the issu-
ance of the following proposed
bonds of the Town of Chapel Hill,
North Carolina, which bonds shall
be subject to the approval of the
voters of said Town at an elec-
tion:
\$47,000 of bonds for the pur-
pose of purchasing firefighting
equipment and apparatus, street
cleaning equipment, and garbage
collection and disposal equipment.
\$15,000 of bonds for the pur-
pose of enlarging and extending
the sanitary sewer system in the
Town.
\$40,000 of bonds for the pur-
pose of enlarging and recon-
structing the surface drainage sewer
system in the Town.
\$38,000 of bonds for the pur-
pose of acquiring land for widen-
ing streets, including the con-
struction or reconstruction of the
surface of streets and including
construction or reconstructing of
contemporaneous curbs and gut-
ters.
\$50,000 of bonds for the pur-
pose of constructing or recon-
structing the surface of streets
including construction or recon-
struction of contemporaneous
curbs and gutters.
This notice was first published
on the 11th day of March, 1955.
Any citizen or taxpayer object-
ing to the issuance of all or any
of said bonds may file with the
Local Government Commission a
verified statement setting forth
his objections as provided in Sec-
tion 159-7.1 of the General Stat-
utes of North Carolina, in which
event he shall also file a copy
of such statement with the under-
signed, at any time within ten
days from and after such first
publication. A copy of this notice
must be attached to the statement
so filed. Objections set forth in
said statement shall be for con-
sideration by said Commission in
its determination of whether or
not it may hold a public hearing
as provided by law on the matter
of issuance of said bonds.
