MINUTES

Board of Aldermen

Town of Chapel Hill, N.C.

The Board of Aldermen met at a Regular Meeting on October 9, 1961, at 7:30 P.M. o'clock with the following present: Mayor McClamroch; Aldermen Robinson, Giduz, Strowd, Page, Wager and Walters; Town Attorney LeGrand and Town Manager Peck.

Minutes for the September 26, 1961, meeting were approved as corrected on a motion by Alderman Page, seconded by Alderman Wager and passed.

Petitions & Delegations:

Canopies on E. Franklin St.

Mr. Y. Z. Cannon came before the Board to represent the merchants of the 100 block of E. Franklin Street. He urged that action be taken; that the Board express willingness in the matter and recommended that an Ordinance be drawn regulating signs in business districts, followed by a regulation covering marquees. Alderman Giduz moved the adoption of the following: That the Town of Chapel Hill grant permission to local businessmen to install poles to support a metal canopy on the north side of the first block of E. Franklin Street subject to the following conditions:

1. Presentation of signed contracts for this project representing 2/3 of the front footage of this block, exclusive of the Post Office property.
2. Approval of the Town Manager of the overall plan for the canopy project, and in particular, the safety of the canopy, and
3. The drawing up of proposed restrictions on business signs, seconded by Alderman Page, and unanimously adopted.

Drainage Problem at 303 Sunset Drive

Mr. Curney Atwater came before the Board and complained that water drains down onto his property as a result of curb and gutter which was installed in that area; that he has requested relief and urges that something be done in the matter. Town Manager stated he will investigate the situation.

Auditor's Report

Mr. E. E. Peacock stated that he has examined the vouchers for the months July, August and September and found them with the exception of 2 or 3, to be in order and properly supported. The exceptions were: Two cases of questionable support to "Travel" fund expense, also a bill from Vine Veterinary Hospital for "Dogs Confined" which covers over a years service, and Stancell Motors lack of billing and settling with the Town for sale of town auto tags for the year 1961.

The Board agreed that a policy should be set up to cover travel expenses; that Dr. Vine should bill the Town at least quarterly; that Charles Stancell should also make a regular accounting. Mr. Peacock stated that he is well along with the Annual Audit and hopes to have it completed no later than December 15, if not before.

ZONING:

Subdivision Rolling Hills - Preliminary Plat

Alderman Strowd moved that the recommendation of the Planning Board to approve the Preliminary Plat, be accepted by the Aldermen, seconded by Alderman Page, and passed.

Proposed Road between U.S. 51-501 & Old Durham Rd.

The Board of Aldermen discussed the need for this proposed road together with Mr. E. N. Richards of Security Homes. Alderman Strowd moved that the Aldermen accept the recommendation of the Planning Board to approve the road; that the best possible intersection be secured, seconded by Alderman Robinson and passed. The Mayor and Town Manager were requested to use whatever influence possible in the matter.

Valley Drive-In Theater -Rezoning

The Planning Board reported that no action is necessary as the petitioners have withdrawn the petition in this matter.

Height Restrictions

Alderman Wager moved that the recommendation of the Planning Board to amend the Zoning Ordinance to Modify Height Restrictions as follows: That Note G, "Exceptions," of the Table of District Regulations of the "Ordinance Providing for the Zoning of Chapel Hill and Surrounding Areas," as adopted March 14, 1955, and subsequently amended, be and the same is amended by adding at the bottom the following subsection "S. Any structure located on college or university property may exceed the maximum height limits set forth herein provided the height of the structure does not exceed the horizontal distance from the base of the structure to the closest point on the nearest private property line." This to be heard November 27, 1961, seconded by Alderman Robinson, and passed.

Sign Ordinance & Franklin Street Marquees.

The Board agreed that the Planning Board and the Town Manager will work on this matter.

Rezoning request of Mrs. Marie McArthur

The Board discussed the request of Mrs. McArthur for a special Public Hearing to rezone from RA-6 to RA-10 an area on N. Columbia Street, as, due to health reasons, she seeks to leave this area. The Aldermen accepted the recommendation of the Planning Board to hear the matter at the November quarterly hearing.

Building Inspector Resigns

Alderman Walters moved that the Board of Aldermen concur with the sentiment expressed by the Board of Adjustment to Howard Stewart by adopting the following :

Resolution

WHEREAS, Howard L. Stewart has submitted his resignation as Building Inspector to the Town of Chapel Hill, and will shortly leave this area to become Town Manager of Cary, North Carolina; and

WHEREAS, said Howard Stewart has served the Chapel Hill Board of Adjustment well and faithfully in his capacity as Building Inspector for several years; and

WHEREAS, the Chapel Hill Zoning Board of Adjustment contemplates his leaving with profound regret; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board hereby express its thanks to Howard L. Stewart for his past services and extend to him its best wishes for his future success.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution be entered upon the minutes of the Chapel Hill Board of Adjustment and that a copy be forwarded to the Mayor and Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO VEHICULAR TRAFFIC ON THROUGH STREETS AND AT STOP SIGNS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

SECTION I.

That the Police Department of the Town of Chapel Hill, pursuant to the provisions of Section 20-158, General Statutes of North Carolina and under the supervision of the Town Manager, shall cause to be erected at the intersections of the streets hereinafter listed under the heading designated in Section II hereof as "THROUGH STREETS", with the streets therein listed and designated under the heading "STOP STREETS", signs notifying drivers of vehicles traveling on the streets designated in Section II hereof as "STOP STREETS" to come to a full stop before entering or crossing the streets therein designated as "THROUGH STREETS". Whenever any such sign has been erected, it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle traveling on a street listed under the heading in Section II hereof entitled "STOP STREETS" to fail to stop in obedience to said stop sign and to yield the right of way to vehicles being operated on the streets designated as "THROUGH STREETS" and approaching or already within said intersections.

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO VEHICULAR TRAFFIC ON "THROUGH STREETS" AT "YIELD RIGHT-OF-WAY" SIGNS

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

SECTION I.

That the Police Department of the Town of Chapel Hill, pursuant to the provisions of Section 20-158.1, General Statutes of North Carolina, and under the supervision of the Town Manager, shall cause to be erected at the intersections of the streets hereinafter listed

under the heading designated in Section II hereof as "THROUGH STREETS", with the streets therein listed and designated under the heading "SERVIENT STREETS", signs notifying drivers of vehicles traveling on the streets designated in Section II hereof as "SERVIENT STREETS" to yield the right-of-way to drivers of vehicles approaching the intersection on the streets designated in Section II hereof as "THROUGH STREETS". Whenever any such yield right-of-way signs have been so erected, it shall be unlawful for the driver of any vehicle traveling on a street designated as "SERVIENT STREET" to enter or cross a street listed under the heading in Section II hereof entitled "THROUGH STREETS" unless he shall first slow down and yield the right-of-way to any vehicle in movement on the "THROUGH STREET" which is approaching so as to arrive at the intersection at approximately the same time as the vehicle entering the "THROUGH STREET".

Parking on W. Rosemary Street

The Board discussed parking on the North side only between N. Columbia Street and Church Street as there are many business entrances along the South side of the street.

Alderman Page moved the adoption of the following:

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING ON ROSEMARY STREET BETWEEN BOUNDARY STREET AND THE TOWN LIMITS OF CARRBORO, NORTH CAROLINA

SECTION I.

That the ordinance heretofore adopted by the Board of Aldermen dated September 10, 1956, entitled "An Ordinance Relating to Parking on Rosemary Street between Boundary Street and the Town Limits of Carrboro, North Carolina", which ordinance as amended appears on Page 180 of the 1961 Revised Compilation of Chapel Hill Ordinances, be and the same is hereby repealed.

SECTION II.

That from and after October 9, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on East Rosemary Street between Boundary Street and North Columbia Street except as otherwise provided in the Parking Meter Ordinance as amended.

SECTION III.

That from and after October 9, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the south side of West Rosemary Street west of the western property line of North Columbia Street nearer than 170 feet to the said western line of North Columbia Street except as otherwise provided in the Parking Meter Ordinance as amended.

SECTION IV.

That from and after October 9, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the South Side of West Rosemary Street east of the eastern property line of Church Street nearer than 150 feet to the said eastern line of Church Street.

SECTION V.

That from and after October 9, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on either side of West Rosemary Street west of the western property line of Church Street nearer than 175 feet to the said western line of Church Street.

SECTION VI.

That from and after the 9th day of October, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the North side of West Rosemary Street between North Columbia Street and Church Street.

SECTION VII.

That from and after the 9th day of October, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the South side of West Rosemary Street between Church Street and Roberson Street.

SECTION VIII.

That from and after the 9th day of October, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the South side of West Rosemary Street within one hundred (100) feet of either side of the intersection of Pritchard Lane or Avenue and West Rosemary Street.

SECTION IX.

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Alderman Giduz moved the adoption of the following:

RESOLUTION RELATING TO STREET PAVING

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

That from and after the 9th day of October, 1961, the policy of the Town of Chapel Hill, with respect to street paving, shall be that where property owners petition for street improvements, the total cost thereof, including curb and gutter, grading, storm sewers, sub-grade material and asphalt surfacing shall be assessed against the property abutting the improvement on each side of the street not however to exceed \$6.00 per front foot; it being the purpose of this resolution to clarify and modify the resolution of March 14, 1960,

which appears on Page 248 of the 1961 Revised Compilation of Chapel Hill Ordinances.

Alderman Walters moved the adoption of the following:

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING ON NORTH COLUMBIA STREET

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

SECTION I.

That from and after the 9th day of October, 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind on the East side of North Columbia Street between the Northern edge of the entrance to the parking lot of the Chapel Hill Parking Association and the Southern property line of East Rosemary Street. The Town Manager shall have the three (3) parking Meters heretofore placed within said area removed.

SECTION II.

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

Alderman Giduz moved the adoption of the following:

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO PARKING DURING SNOW STORMS

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

SECTION I.

That from and after the first day of November 1961, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind, or leave one parked on Franklin Street or Rosemary Street between Spring Lane and the Carrboro Town limits or on the portion of Henderson Street, N. Columbia Street, N. Church Street, Roberson Street, or Graham Street lying between Franklin Street and Rosemary Street after two inches (2") of snow have fallen on such streets and before the snow has been removed therefrom.

SECTION II.

Any vehicle parked in violation hereof may be removed by Town authorities at the owner's cost.

SECTION III.

All ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.

seconded by Alderman Walters, and unanimously adopted.

E.A. Brown Building - W. Rosemary St.

After much discussion Alderman Giduz moved that the Town offer to pay \$3,000.00 plus a concrete sidewalk in return for an 8 foot easement for the sidewalk; that this offer does not include any additional cost of reconstruction of any building, seconded by Alderman Stroud, and passed.

Sewer Rental Charge - Ice Manufacturers

Mr. James Riggsbee, of the Chapel Hill Ice Company complained that, in his case, the Town's sewer charge based on water consumed was unfair because most of the water was sold as ice. After discussion Alderman Page moved that the sewer charge ordinance be amended to provide a maximum for ice plants of double the minimum charges, seconded by Alderman Strowd, and passed.

Zoning Request - Masterbilt Homes, Inc.

Masterbilt Homes, Inc. requested a special hearing on a rezoning and special use request as it involved a fallout shelter and special F.H.A. approval. Motion by Alderman Walters, seconded by Alderman Strowd that the request for a special hearing be denied. Carried.

Recreation Commission

The Board considered the letter from the Recreation Commission wherein it advised that terms expire for two of its members, Robert Culten and Joseph Johnston and named Mr. Ross Scroggs and Mrs. Mary King Kouns for consideration. Alderman Walters moved that incumbents Robert Culten be reappointed for three years and Johnston for five years, be accepted. (Alderman Page requested that a "voice" vote be accepted. The motion was seconded by Alderman Giduz, and passed.

Sewer Rent Refunded

Mr. Clyde Mullis who lives outside the Town listed his personal property for 1961 together with his lot at #45 Glendale Street. He requests that the amount of \$17.49 less \$0.08 discount, be refunded (\$1,590 @ \$1.10). Alderman Giduz moved that the personal property tax in the amount of \$17.41 erroneously listed, be refunded, seconded by Alderman Robinson, and passed.

Mr. R. A. Jolly requests a refund for \$12.00 sewer rental for the year 1960 as his property at 806 E. Franklin Street is not connected to the sanitary sewer line. Alderman Walters moved that the \$12.00 erroneously charged, be refunded, seconded by Alderman Page, and passed.

Overpayment on Sewer Rentals Due to Town's Change of Policy

Mayor McClamroch read the following list of tax payers who have overpaid through prepayments on 1961 taxes on account of the policy of charging sewer rentals based on water consumption for the 1960 year rather than on number of toilets contained in the property. New Business:

The Board discussed two untidy lots on Durham Road where high grass and weeds should be cut. Alderman Wager stated that every day there are from 5 to 7 cars parked illegally on the W. side of Pittsboro Street. Alderman Walters urged that planing be done at #2 Fire Station at Glen Lennox. Town Manager stated that grassy banks are effective and easily cared for. Alderman Robinson discussed paving the alley at the back of Johnson-Strowd-Ward building on W. Franklin Street which leaves the alley up to Roberson Street unpaved; that storm sewer is needed; that it might be done on an assessment basis. He asked that the Street Committee investigate this problem. Town Attorney stated he believes this is a private alley; that Town hopes to get started on paving in a few days (School Lane). Town Manager stated that the rezoning request of R.E. Page, 125 S. Graham Street will be considered at hearing on November 27. Alderman Robinson stated that area of Hollywood Grill storm drainage is Town's number one commitment, also that consideration should be given to Mrs. Foust's property where there are rotted sills and front porch due to lack of drainage. The Board agreed to take care of this drainage problem as soon as practical.

There being no further business to be considered at this time, the meeting was adjourned at 10:20.

Board of Alderman

Town of Chapel Hill, N.C.

The Board of Aldermen met at a Public Hearing on October 24, 1961, at 7:30 P.M. o'clock with the following present: Mayor McClamroch; Aldermen Wager, Page, Walters, Strowd, Robinson and Giduz; Town Attorney LeGrand and Town Manager Peck. Members of the Planning Board present were: Messrs. Powell, chairman, Burns, Stewart, Smith, and Wallace, also Charles Turner and Lucien Foust.

Mayor McClamroch stated that the purpose of the meeting was to conduct a public hearing which has been properly advertised in the matter of major power lines; that the public is urged to discuss the matter at this time as the Aldermen will refer it to the Planning Board for a recommendation which will be submitted to the Aldermen for its next meeting.

A large delegation of interested persons appeared before the Board of Aldermen to urge that the amendment to the zoning ordinance requiring a permit to be issued by the Board of Aldermen for construction of electric transmission lines, be adopted. Attorney Battle acted as spokesman for the delegation, and he supplied a petition signed by 491 persons who oppose the building of the proposed line through the Morgan Creek area.
