RESOLUTION-SEWER IMPROVEMENTS

BE IT RESOLVED b the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill that a sewage collector system be constructed to serve McMasters Street, or a portion thereof.

The system shall be constructed under the supervision of the Town Engineer in accordance with specifications prepared by him and consist of eight inch lines of terra cotta pipe or cast iron pipe. The collector lines shall extend from the south end of an outfall line to be constructed by the Town of Chapel Hill from the Bolin Creek ourfall, to serve all properties on the north side of McMasters Street west of this ourfall line that can be served by gravity from this line.

The total cost of this project should be assessed against the lots which can be served directly by this collector line at an equal cost to each lot regardless of the frontage on the street or on the sewer line. Assessments may be paid over a period of ten (10) years, with one tenth of the total assessment being due each year with an interest charge of 6% per annum on all unpaid balance.

This the 11th day of January, 1965.

This was seconded by Alderman Walters and carried unanimously.

DEPOSIT OF FUNDS

Alderman Wager moved, seconded by Alderman Page, that \$10,000.00 pf the recent gift to the Recreation Department be deposited, \$5,000.00 in the Orange Savings & Loan and \$5,000.00 in the Home Savings & Loan. This was approved unanimously.

COMMUNITY APPEARANCE

Alderman Walters suggested that it might be well for the Town to appoint a Fine Arts Commission to consider community appearance, particularly in special use projects such as apartments. The Town Manager was asked to obtain information concerning this from the City of Winston Salem, Robert Stipe of the Institute of Government and the Community Planning Division of the Department of Conservation and Development.

TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

MINUTES

Alderman Walters moved that the minutes of the meeting of January 11, 1965 be approved as corrected. This was seconded be Alderman Strewd and carried unanimously.

PLANNING AREA

Mr. Ross Scroggs, Chairman of the Planning Board, reported on a meeting with the Carrboro Planning Board concerning the planning of the area surrounding the new high school. Alderman Giduz moved that Mayor McClamroch, and any others that he desired, confer with representatives of the Garrboro Town Board, the County Commissioners and with Donald Stanford and Don Matheson, Orange County Representatives to the General Assembly. This motion was seconded by Alderman Strowd and carried unanimously.

PARKING-PITTSBORO & RANSOM STREET

Alderman Strewd moved that an ordinance be prepared reducing the parking on Pittsbero Street, Ransom Street and W. University Drive to improve the flow of moving traffic. This was seconded by Alderman Giduz and carried unanimously.

OFF STREET LOADING

Mayor McClamroch read a proposed ordinance on parking and leading in the alley between East Franklin Street and East Rosemary Street. Alderman Giduz moved adoption of the ordinance as follows:

AN ORDINANCE RELATING TO TRAFFIC, PARKING AND LOADING ON THE ALLEY BETWEEN EAST FRANKLIN STREET, EAST ROSEMARY STREET, NORTH COLUMBIA STREET AND HENDERSON STREET

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill;

SECTION I.

That from and after the 26th day of January , 1965, it shall be unlawful to park an automobile or vehicle of any kind at any time in the alleyway located between East Rosemary Street and East Franklin Street, which alleyway extends southwardly from the southern line of East Rosemary Street just east of the Chapel Hill Parking Facility for a distance of approximately 180 feet, turning thence eastwardly approximately parallel to East Rosemary Street 375 feet more or less to the property line of the U. S. Post Office. then extending northwardly 160 feet more or less along the Post Office property to the southern line of Rosemary Street, except that in the portion parallel to Rosemary Street parking shall be permitted for the active loading and unloading of trucks. Trucks being loaded or unloaded must be parked in the southern one-half of the alley and shall not at any time completely block the alley.

SECTION II.

Traffic on the portion of the above described alley adjacent to the Post Office property shall be used only for northbound traffic. Two-way traffic shall be permitted on other portions of the alley. SECTION III.

All traffic emerging from either end of the alley onto Rosemary Street shall come to a complete stop and shall yield right of way to any traffic on Rosemary Street.

SECTION IV.

All ordinances or portions of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed.
