

PAY INCREASES

Alderman Strowd moved, seconded by Alderman Kage, that all pay increases shown in the Budget become effective July 1, 1965 and that payment at the end of July be authorized. This was unanimously passed.

REPLACEMENT-LT. MERRITT

Alderman Giduz moved, seconded by Alderman Prothro, that replacement of Lt. Merritt in the Police Department be authorized prior to the final adoption of the Budget. This was unanimously carried.

PURCHASE OF CAR FOR BUILDING INSPECTOR

Alderman Varley moved, seconded by Alderman Strowd, that a car be purchased as soon as possible for the Building Inspector and used as a replacement for the wrecked police car until a new police car can be obtained. This was passed unanimously.

MINUTESBOARD OF ALDERMENTOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

The Board of Aldermen met at a regular meeting on July 26, 1965 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor McClamroch, Aldermen Varley, Prothro, Page, Kage, Giduz and Strowd; also present were Town Manager Peck, Town Clerk Roberts and Town Attorney LeGrand.

MINUTES

Alderman Prothro moved, seconded by Alderman Varley, that the minutes of the regular meeting of July 12, 1965 be approved as distributed. This was unanimously carried.

Alderman Giduz moved, seconded by Alderman Strowd, that the minutes of the special meeting held on July 20, 1965 be approved as distributed. This was unanimously carried.

BUDGET

Alderman Strowd moved that the appropriation item "6365 Street Cleaning" be increased by \$12,000 to include the purchase of a street sweeper for \$10,500 and operating cost for the sweeper of \$1,500, and that item "8000 Contingency" be reduced by \$12,000. This was seconded by Alderman Giduz and approved unanimously.

OPEN SPACE

Mayor McClamroch asked Town Attorney LeGrand to report on his study of the proposed intergovernmental contract for open space. Mr. LeGrand recommended not approving the contract in the present form as it is rather ambiguous but appears to commit the Town up to provide money for acquisition for open space based on decisions other than that by the Board of Aldermen. Pearson Stewart told the Board that new legislation would eliminate any requirement for Regional approval for acquisition for open space. Alderman Strowd moved, seconded by Alderman Giduz, that no action be taken on this until the August 9 meeting and that the Town Attorney be asked to reword this contract to eliminate some of the ambiguities. This was unanimously adopted.

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AMBULANCE SERVICE

Mr. LeGrand was asked to report on his investigation of the proposed County franchise and requested resolution by the Board of Aldermen. Mr. LeGrand stated that in his opinion neither the Town nor the County had the authority to grant such a franchise, and that if the Town did have it it would be an unlawful delegation of authority for the Town to ask the County to franchise ambulances on the basis of the Town's authority. He recommended not adopting this in his present form. Alderman Giduz noted that there were presently two companies giving ambulance service in the Town of Chapel Hill. Alderman Giduz moved, seconded by Alderman Kage, that this matter be referred again to the Town Attorney for additional study and conference with the County Attorney and possible rewording of the resolution to make it satisfactory to both the Town and the County. Town Manager was asked to discuss this with Dr. Cadmus who has recently completed a statewide study on ambulance service. This motion was unanimously approved.

PERSONNEL ORDINANCE

Alderman Varley moved the adoption of the following amendment to the Town's Personnel Ordinance:

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND THE ORDINANCE OF THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL PROVIDING FOR PERSONNEL POLICIES, A POSITION CLASSIFICATION PLAN, AND A PAY PLAN COVERING EMPLOYMENT BY THE TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill:

Section I. That the ordinance entitled, "An Ordinance of the Town of Chapel Hill Providing for Personnel Policies, a Position classification Plan, and a Pay Plan Covering Employment by the Town of Chapel Hill," as adopted on June 27, 1961, be and the same is hereby amended by striking out all of Table I thereof entitled, "Schedule of Salary Ranges, Town of Chapel Hill, June, 1961" and the table entitled "Classes Grouped by Salary Ranges, Town of Chapel Hill, July, 1965, which appear immediately following Section 16 of said ordinance, and by inserting in lieu thereof the following:

BOARD OF ALDERMEN

TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

The Board of Aldermen met at a Special Meeting on August 2, 1965 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor McClamroch, Aldermen Strowd, Giduz, Kage, Page, and Varley. Alderman Prothro was absent. Also present were Town Manager Peck and Town Clerk Roberts.

BUDGET

Mayor McClamroch read the proposed Budget Ordinance for the fiscal year 1965-66. Alderman Kage moved that this Budget be approved as read. The motion was seconded by Alderman Varley. Alderman Giduz then asked that the action on the Budget be deferred pending discussion of a resolution which he had prepared. This was agreed to by the Board.

RESOLUTION-POLICE DEPARTMENT

Alderman Giduz moved the adoption of the following resolution:

The Town of Chapel Hill expresses its grief and shock at the murder of a woman student at the University in Chapel Hill and hereby extends to the family of Miss Suellan Evans of Mooresville, N.C., its deep feeling of sympathy.

The Town has ascertained that all possible steps toward apprehension of the culprit in this case are being taken by the duly-constituted investigating authorities and hereby gives official assurance that this investigation shall have all of the support necessary from the local government, to the end that the guilty party may be sought out, arrested, and convicted.

To further insure that all resources necessary to this investigation shall be available to those charged with it, the Town hereby resolves to make a special appropriation to the Chapel Hill Police Department to be used within legal authority of the Chief of Police and in his discretion for any special expenses that may arise during this investigation.

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
