RESOLUTION-POLICE DEPARTMENT

Alderman Giduz moved the adoption of the following resolution:

The Town of Chapel Hill expresses its grief and shock at the murder of a woman student at the University in Chapel Hill and hereby extends to the family of Miss Suellan Evans of Mooresville, N.C., its deep feeling of sympathy.

The Town has ascertained that all possible steps toward apprehension of the culprit in this case are being taken by the dulyconstituted investigating authorities and hereby gives official assurnace that htis investigation shall have all of the support necessary from the local government, to the end that the guilty party may be sought out, arrested, and convicted.

To further insure that all resources necessary to this investigation shall be available to those charged with it, the Town hereby resolves to make a special appropriation to the Chapel Hill Police Department to be used within legal authority of the Chief of Police and in his descretion for any special expenses that may arise during this investigation.

The Town urges all citizens to give their thoughful and carefully-considered cooperation in providing possible helpful information to Chapel Hill police in connection with the investigation of this heinous crime.

In this regard the Town of Chapel Hill hereby offers a reward of \$1,000 from non-tax funds, if legally permissable, for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the culprit in this case.

MINUTES

BOARD OF ALDERMEN

TOWN OF CHAPEL HILL

The Board of Aldermen met at a regular meeting on August 9, 1965 at 7:30 p.m. with the following members present: Mayor McClamroch, Aldermen Page, Prothro, Varley, Giduz and Strowd. Alderman Kage was absent. Also present were Town Manager Peck, Town Clerk Roberts and Town Attorney LeGrand.

AUDITOR'S REPORT

Auditor, Erle Peacock, presented the Audit of the Chapel Hill Recorder's Court for the year 1963-64. He indicated there was a non-collection for that year of \$1,106.60 in 37 cases. The Board asked Judge Phipps to explain the position of the court in allowing defendants time to pay. Judge Phipps said that record of collections was quite good, and that the alternative would be to impose an immediate jail sentence, and that the defendant, the State, and the Town were all better off by allowing a certain amount of time for payment of a fine or cost.

SPECIAL USE REQUEST-FRATERNITY-PITTSBORO STREET

Mayor McClamroch read transmittal from the Planning Board which unanimously recommended disapproval of the special use request for a fraternity on Pittsboro Street submitted by the Kappa Council, Inc. Alderman Giduz moved, seconded by Alderman Prothro, that the request for fraternity use on Pittsboro Street by Kappa Council be denied because it had been clearly demonstrated during the hearing that there would be an excessive devaluation of the surrounding properties. This was adopted by a vote of 4-0 with Alderman Strowd abstaining as a member of the Board of Stewards of the Methodist Church, owner of a portion of this property.
