



EMERGENCY ALARM SYSTEM

MINUTES

January 30, 1973

Board of Aldermen

Town of Chapel Hill

The Board of Aldermen met at a special meeting on January 30, 1973 at 5:00 P.M. with the following members present: Mayor Lee, Aldermen Marshall, Nassif, Scroggs, Smith, and Welsh. Also present were Interim Town Manager Levine, Town Clerk Roberts, and Town Attorney Denny.

Mayor Lee explained that this meeting was called to consider filling the vacancy on the Board of Aldermen, a utilities proposal, and the Director of Urban Development position.

Mayor Lee called for petitions. None were presented.

Alderman Nassif said that Board members did not like to appoint other members, but an election could not be held at this time, and that it was the duty of the Board to fill the vacancy. He said that the Board members had tried to come up with someone with a philosophy and background similar to George Coxhead's. Aldermen Nassif nominated Mr. Thomas Gardner for the vacancy and gave biographical information about Mr. Gardner. Alderman Smith said he had no other nominations and would support the appointment of Mr. Gardner, who, in his opinion, knows the people of Chapel Hill and is concerned about the Town. Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, to close the nominations and appoint Mr. Thomas Gardner to fill the vacancy on the Board of Aldermen replacing Mr. George Coxhead. This motion was unanimously carried. Alderman Nassif asked that Interim Manager Levine meet with Mr. Gardner and brief him on town operations before the next regular meeting of the Board.

UTILITIES

Mayor Lee described the work of the Utilities Task Force and called on Mr. Sandy McClamrock, a member of the Task Force, to explain the Task Force's proposal. Mr. McClamrock said the proposal was for the Towns of Chapel Hill and Carrboro and the County to join in a corporate agreement to purchase the utilities from the University of North Carolina and to share the costs at a rate of 1/3 each. He read a letter from the Town of Carrboro endorsing the proposal and asked for the Chapel Hill Aldermen's endorsement. Alderman Smith moved, seconded by Alderman Welsh, that the Chapel Hill Board of Aldermen endorse the proposal, its plans and objectives, and pledge its intent to enter into utilities system from the University of North Carolina. This motion was unanimously carried. Mayor Lee asked that a letter of support from the Chapel Hill Board be prepared and given to Mr. McClamrock to be presented to the County Commissioners. Alderman Nassif thanked the Task Force for its work on this proposal.

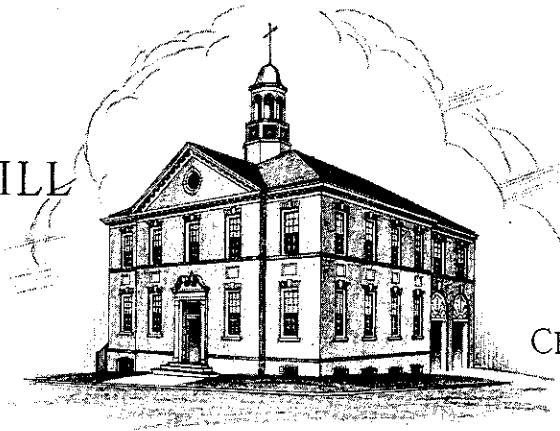
PERSONNEL

Interim Manager Levine said that she had considered several possibilities for the position of Director of Urban Development and asked that the Board reconsider the salary for this position. Alderman Nassif moved, seconded by Alderman Marshall, to authorize the Interim Town Manager to offer \$17,000 to \$18,000 as a starting salary for the position of Director of Urban Development. This motion was unanimously carried.



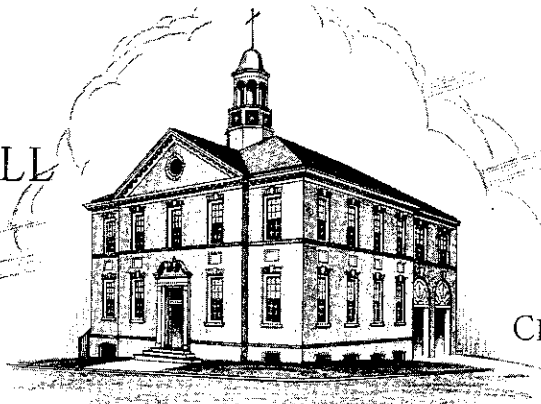
