Dear Sirs:

At a recent meeting of the officers and directors of the local Merchants Association, I was asked to convey to you several requests relative to the general conditions and appearances of the business district.

The items that we would like for you to give immediate consideration are - the broken curbs and irregular sidewalk blocks in the business section of East Franklin Street.

Trash and trash cans seem to be getting worse; therefore, we call upon you to take such action as necessary to correct this problem.

At this meeting a great deal of concern was expressed about the growing number of signs and low awnings in the business section. Upon investigating your building code we fail to find any regulations concerning the extension of the signs beyond the building line and the height of the awnings from the sidewalk. These features were the chief objections to these items.

We would like to call upon you to appoint such committee as necessary to make an investigation of these conditions mentioned above, and whatever other suggestions you, and the members of the Board, might have to make our town an attractive place to shop.

ORDINANCE RELATED TO PARKING ON SOUTH COLUMBIA STREET
BETWEEN CAMERON AVENUE AND MCCAULEY STREET

Putnam Moved, Lital seconded

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill that from and after the 20th day of March, 1952, it shall be unlawful for any person to park a motor vehicle or other vehicle at any time on either side of South Columbia Street between Cameron Avenue and McCauley Street, except temporarily for the purpose of receiving or discharging passengers or loading and unloading merchandise.

This the 27th day of February, 1952.

Each and every violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of \$1.00.

Minutes Regular Meeting
Board of Aldermen--Chapel Hill, N. C.
March 10, 1952

The regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Town Hall on March 10, 1952 at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present were Mayor Lanier, Aldermen Fowler, Fitch, Putnam, Burch, Davis, Town Manager Rose, and Town Attorney LeGrand.

The minutes for the regular meeting of February 27, 1952 were read and approved.

Mr. Duncan Neville came before the Board to be advised whether or not he would be able to connect to the city sewer line. After much discussion on this matter Mr. Neville was informed that at the present the Town did not find it feasible to extend the sewer line to his property. Mr. LeGrand, Town Attorney was asked to look up the deed to the property of Mr. H. C. Holloway giving him the right-of-way to cross Dr. Nathan's property in installing a sewer line.

Mr. Rose read a letter from Johnson-Stroud-Ward stating that they planned to expand their building on West Franklin Street and they requested that the tree in front of their furniture store be removed because they beleived it to be dangerous. Mr. Rose reported that he had had Mr. Armstrong look at this tree and Mr. Armstrong was of the opinion that this tree was not dangerous. Mr. Burch stated that he thought the people would rather have new trees planted and have the old ones removed. After further discussion Mr. Fowler moved that Mr. Rose be authorized to remove the tree in question. This motion was seconded by Mr. Davis and unanimously passed.

Mr. Rose presented each member of the board with copies of the Police and Court monthly reports.

The Health Report was read by Mr. Rose. It contained a list of places that had been visited by the health department. Several complaints were made about septic tanks and sewer lines.

Mr. Rose read a list of names of people who had been connected to the sewer line in Davie Circle. Mr. Lanier asked the board to be thinking about surfacing the roads in Davie Circle. Mr. Lanier asked the Town Manager and Town Attorney to look up

the ordinance on whether a person had to connect to the sewer line if his septic tank was in good condition.

Mr. Rose reported that he would like to get the board to have a series of plots reserved for paupers in the Colored Cemetery. The Colored Funeral Directors would also like to have a tool house at the cemetery. After much discussion Mr. Fowler moved that all questions concerning the cemeteries be referred to the Cemetery Committee and Town Manager. This motion was seconded by Mr. Putnam and unanimously passed.

✓ The following resolution as presented:

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Aldermen of the Town of Chapel Hill ask the University of North Carolina to cooperate with the Town in widening South Columbia Street 5 feet on the East Side from the Carolina Inn intersection on Cameron Avenue to the Texaco Filling Station crossing the intersection on Franklin Street. This resolution was unanimously passed.

It was reported by the Mayor that Mr. C. E. Teague and Mr. W. D. Carmichael, Jr. could not recommend to the Chancellor, the President, and to the Board of Trustees that the North East corner of the Carolina Inn Lawn be cut off as proposed by the Town.

Mr. Rose read a letter from the Chapel Hill Planning Board concerning Mrs. DeLancy's request for a rezoning of her lot behind the Porthole. They had decided that for all concerned that they would have to refuse this request.

Mr. Rose explained that Mr. Grady Pritchard is of the opinion that when the Westwood sewer pumping station was built on his property he had an understanding with the Town that he would not be liable for sewer rent on his home. He paid the Town the sum of \$42.00 for sewer rent for 1950 which he claims was in error. He would like \$24.00 of this amount to be refunded to him and the same amount for 1951 be released. Mr. Rose was authorized to collect sewer rent from Mr. Pritchard.

Mr. LeGrand presented the changed contract for the University Motor Lodge to the board. After looking over this contract Mr. Fitch made the motion that this contract be adopted. Mr. Putnam seconded this motion and it was unanimously passed.

Upon motion of Mr. Cornwell and seconded by Mr. Putnam the following ordinance was unanimously passed:

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Aldermen of the Town of

Chapel Hill, North Carolina that from and after the 20th day of March, 1952, it shall be lawful to park automobiles and other vehicles on West Franklin Street between Columbia Street and Mallette Street; except that it shall be unlawful to park on the South side of West Franklin Street between Columbia Street and Mallette Street within the area extending along the curbs on the South side of said West Franklin Street for a distance of 28 feet in front of the elementary school, which area has been designated by yellow marked lines placed under the direction of the Town Manager.

Each and every violation of this ordinance shall be punishable by a fine of \$1.00.

This the 10th day of March, 1952.

Mr. Rose was asked to notify the taxicab companies that the rates fixed for fares inside the Town limits of Chapel Hill, North Carolina, shall apply to the newly annexed areas.

Mr. Fitch reported that the finance committee had met and discussed the delinquent taxes. They had studied the notices that had been sent out and returned with notations. After further study they planned to recommend that the Town Manager be authorized to release certain taxes that are uncollectible. Mr. Rose stated that a list had been given Mr. Jordan to find out any information available about the people whose notices had been returned and marked unknown.

Upon motion made by Mr. Burch and seconded by Mr. Putnam, and unanimous consent the meeting adjourned at 9:55 P. M.

After hearing the minutes of the Board of Aldermen for March 10, 1952 read as amended, on motion made by Aldermen Cornwell and seconded by Aldermen Putnam the minutes were approved by vote of the Board of Aldermen this the 24th day of March, 1952.
