"Minutes of Regular Meeting"  
Board of Aldermen--Chapel Hill, N. C.  
April 28, 1952

The regular meeting of the Board of Aldermen was held in the Town Hall on April 28, 1952, at 8 o'clock P. M.

Present were Mayor Lanier, Aldermen Putnam, Fowler, Burch, Fitch, Cornwell, Auditor Peacock, Attorney LeGrand, and Town Manager Rose.

Miss Elizabeth Branson, Mr. William Harrison, and Mr. Y. Z. Cannon appeared before the Board in reference to the proposed regulations on signs and awnings prepared by a committee of the Merchants Associations. Mr. Cannon outlined the proposed regulations, and after some discussion the matter was referred to the Safety Committee for recommendations to be reported back to the Board.

Messrs. James Snipes, C. A. McDougal, C. F. Williams, W. A. Lampley and James Peace, representing the Negro Civic Club, presented a request for further consideration of the matter of a traffic light at W. Franklin Street and Merritt Mill Road. James Snipes reported that a survey had shown 344 crossings of the intersection by school children. After some discussion the matter was referred to the Safety Committee for further study and recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

The Town Manager read another written request from Mrs. Josie DeLancy for reconsideration of the rezoning of her lot at the Northwest Corner of the University Campus. On motion of Alderman Fitch, seconded by Aldermen Putnam, the matter was referred to the Board of Adjustment for consideration as a hardship case for use as a residence.

The Town Manager read a request from Mr. C. S. Bartlett, representing the Taxicab operators, for a hearing on taxicab fares. The matter was referred to the Utilities Committee with the request that they hold a hearing with the operators and report their recommendations at the next meeting of the Board.

Town Attorney, LeGrand, reported to the Board on the Grover Bush case and the Groves case. The Town Manager presented a bill from Mr. Bonner Sawyer in the amount of \$100.00 for services on the Bush case and a bill in the amount of \$45.25 for printing of the appeal to the Supreme Court in the Groves Case. On motion of Aldermen Putnam, seconded by Aldermen Fowler, the bills were approved and ordered to be paid out of the Contingency Fund.

Town Manager Rose was authorized to refund \$4.29 to C. A. Houck for taxes charged in error.
